industrialisation The development of industry on an extensive scale.



<u>capitalism</u>	An economic system based on private ownership of capital. Private ownership is a key feature of capitalism .
<u>city</u>	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. Ancient Troy was a great city .
<u>civilization</u>	The stage of human social and cultural development and organization that is considered most advanced. The early civilizations of Mesopotamia and Egypt.



<u>urbanization</u>	The condition of being urbanized. <i>Public opposition to the urbanization of the countryside.</i>
westernization	Assimilation of Western culture; the social process of becoming familiar with or converting to the customs and practices of Western civilization.
