<u>gone</u>	Beyond help; in a hopeless state. Sweet memories of <b>gone</b> summers.
inebriate	Drunk; intoxicated. <i>Inebriate</i> times by the Bay.
intoxicated	Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol. <i>Officials are reporting an increase in the number of</i> <b>intoxicated</b> <i>students requiring medical attention.</i>
<u>ripped</u>	Under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs. Through his slightly too tight shirt you could see he was <b>ripped</b> .

A **tipsy** boat.

under the influence Lower in rank, power, or authority.

# Associations of "Inebriated" (30 Words)

alcohol	A liquor or brew containing alcohol as the active agent. Unpleasant stuff like formaldehyde is produced as <b>alcohol</b> s burn.
alcoholic	Caused by the excessive consumption of alcohol. <i>Alcoholic liver disease.</i>
bacchanal	Used of riotously drunken merrymaking. <i>The debauched and alcoholic president was said to be organizing unceasing</i> <b>bacchanal</b> s.
bacchanalian	Characterized by or given to drunken revelry. A night of <b>bacchanalian</b> revelry.
<u>beer</u>	An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops. <i>He ordered a <b>beer</b>.</i>
bibulous	Excessively fond of drinking alcohol. A <b>bibulous</b> fellow.
carousal	Revelry in drinking; a merry drinking party.
carouse	Drink alcohol and enjoy oneself with others in a noisy, lively way. They danced and <b>carouse</b> d until the drink ran out.
drunken	Given to or marked by the consumption of alcohol. The man s <b>drunken</b> slurred speech.
guzzle	Drink greedily or as if with great thirst. This car <b>guzzle</b> s petrol.
inebriate	Make (someone) drunk; intoxicate. <i>He was <b>inebriate</b>d by his phenomenal success.</i>
inebriety	A temporary state resulting from excessive consumption of alcohol. <i>The ravages of <b>inebriety</b></i> .



intoxicate	Fill with high spirits; fill with optimism. Except for NYC and LA no American city has so <b>intoxicate</b> d and infuriated writers.
intoxicated	As if under the influence of alcohol. <i>He was so <b>intoxicated</b> that he could barely walk.</i>
liquor	Liquid which drains from food during cooking. Waste <b>liquor</b> s.
oaf	A man who is rough or clumsy and unintelligent. They are just big clumsy <b>oaf</b> s.
plastered	Covered with or made of plaster. Coarsely <b>plastered</b> brickwork.
<u>revel</u>	Lively and noisy enjoyment, especially with drinking and dancing. Late night <b>revel</b> s.
reveler	A celebrant who shares in a noisy party. The clubs attract <b>reveler</b> s as young as thirteen.
<u>revelry</u>	Unrestrained merrymaking. Sounds of <b>revelry</b> issued into the night.
shredded	Torn or cut into shreds. Finely <b>shredded</b> cabbage.
<u>sober</u>	Cause to become sober. His expression <b>sober</b> ed her.
spree	Take part in a spree. Crews were seldom going ashore and therefore seldom going on the <b>spree</b> .
<u>stupor</u>	Marginal consciousness. A drunken <b>stupor</b> .
tipple	Drink alcohol, especially habitually. Those who liked to <b>tipple</b> and gamble.
<u>tipsy</u>	Unstable and prone to tip as if intoxicated. A <b>tipsy</b> boat.
