Definitions of "Inebriated" as an adjective

- *Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol).*
- *Drunk; intoxicated.*

Synonyms of "Inebriated" as an adjective (9 Words)

drunken	Drunk or intoxicated. <i>The man s drunken slurred speech.</i>
gone	Beyond help; in a hopeless state. <i>Sweet memories of gone summers.</i>
inebriate	Drunk; intoxicated. <i>Inebriate times by the Bay.</i>
intoxicated	Stupefied or excited by a chemical substance (especially alcohol). <i>Officials are reporting an increase in the number of intoxicated students requiring medical attention.</i>
ripped	Under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs. <i>Through his slightly too tight shirt you could see he was ripped.</i>

the worse for drink Inferior to another in quality or condition or desirability.

tipsy Slightly drunk.
A **tipsy** boat.

under the influence Lower in rank, power, or authority.

Usage Examples of "Inebriated" as an adjective

- *Helplessly inebriated.*
- *I got mildly inebriated.*

Associations of "Inebriated" (30 Words)

alcohol	A liquor or brew containing alcohol as the active agent. <i>Unpleasant stuff like formaldehyde is produced as alcohols burn.</i>
alcoholic	Caused by the excessive consumption of alcohol. <i>Alcoholic liver disease.</i>
bacchanal	Used of riotously drunken merrymaking. <i>The debauched and alcoholic president was said to be organizing unceasing bacchanals.</i>
bacchanalian	Characterized by or given to drunken revelry. <i>A night of bacchanalian revelry.</i>
beer	An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops. <i>He ordered a beer.</i>
bibulous	Excessively fond of drinking alcohol. <i>A bibulous fellow.</i>
carousal	Revelry in drinking; a merry drinking party.
carouse	Drink alcohol and enjoy oneself with others in a noisy, lively way. <i>They danced and caroused until the drink ran out.</i>
drunken	Given to or marked by the consumption of alcohol. <i>The man s drunken slurred speech.</i>
guzzle	Drink greedily or as if with great thirst. <i>This car guzzles petrol.</i>
inebriate	Make (someone) drunk; intoxicate. <i>He was inebriated by his phenomenal success.</i>
inebriety	A temporary state resulting from excessive consumption of alcohol. <i>The ravages of inebriety.</i>

intoxicate	Fill with high spirits; fill with optimism. <i>Except for NYC and LA no American city has so intoxicated and infuriated writers.</i>
<u>intoxicated</u>	As if under the influence of alcohol. <i>He was so intoxicated that he could barely walk.</i>
liquor	Liquid which drains from food during cooking. <i>Waste liquors.</i>
oaf	A man who is rough or clumsy and unintelligent. <i>They are just big clumsy oafs.</i>
plastered	Covered with or made of plaster. <i>Coarsely plastered brickwork.</i>
<u>revel</u>	Lively and noisy enjoyment, especially with drinking and dancing. <i>Late night revels.</i>
reveler	A celebrant who shares in a noisy party. <i>The clubs attract revelers as young as thirteen.</i>
<u>revelry</u>	Unrestrained merrymaking. <i>Sounds of revelry issued into the night.</i>
shredded	Torn or cut into shreds. <i>Finely shredded cabbage.</i>
<u>sober</u>	Cause to become sober. <i>His expression sobered her.</i>
spree	Take part in a spree. <i>Crews were seldom going ashore and therefore seldom going on the spree.</i>
<u>stupor</u>	Marginal consciousness. <i>A drunken stupor.</i>
tipple	Drink alcohol, especially habitually. <i>Those who liked to tipple and gamble.</i>
<u>tipsy</u>	Unstable and prone to tip as if intoxicated. <i>A tipsy boat.</i>
