- Not producing an intended effect.

incompetent Showing lack of skill or aptitude.

The patient is deemed legally **incompetent**.

Lacking in power or forcefulness.

inefficacious Not producing the desired effect.

Laws that are **inefficacious** in stopping crime.

inefficient Not producing desired results; wasteful.

**Inefficient** transport systems.

Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse.

lame Disabled in the feet or legs.

Lacking in specific resources, qualities or substances.

poor A poor land.

**powerless** Without ability, influence, or power.

**purposeless** Done or made with no discernible point or purpose.

A life essentially purposeless.

to no effect Quantifier; used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating

a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of.

unable Lacking necessary physical or mental ability.

Dyslexics are **unable** to learn to read adequately.

unavailing Producing no result or effect.

Their efforts were **unavailing**.

**uneffective** Not producing an intended effect.

unfit Delow the required standards for a purpose
