preordained predestined.

A divinely **preordained** plan of creation.

Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured.

A **sure** or true sign of one s commitment.

sure to happen Reliable in operation or effect.

unavoidable Impossible to avoid or evade.

An unavoidable accident.

The distribution desired.

unpreventable Not able to be prevented or avoided.

Until now this devastating disease has been unpreventable.
