<b>bound to happen</b>	Confined by bonds.
<b><a href="#">certain</a></b>	Certain to occur destined or inevitable Benjamin Franklin. <i>Felt <b>certain</b> of success.</i>
<b>ineliminable</b>	Incapable of being removed or excluded from consideration. <i>An <b>ineliminable</b> feature of the human condition.</i>
<b>ineluctable</b>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The <b>ineluctable</b> facts of history.</i>

<b><u>inevitable</u></b>	Certain to happen; unavoidable. <i>The <b>inevitable</b> changes of the seasons.</i>
<b>inexorable</b>	Impervious to pleas, persuasion, requests, reason. <i>Cynthia was <b>inexorable</b> she would have none of him.</i>
<b>predestined</b>	Established or prearranged unalterably. <i>It seemed <b>predestined</b> since the beginning of the world.</i>
<b><u>predetermined</u></b>	Set in advance. <i>A <b>predetermined</b> level of spending.</i>
<b>preordained</b>	(of an outcome or course of action) decided or determined beforehand; predestined. <i>A divinely <b>preordained</b> plan of creation.</i>
<b><u>sure</u></b>	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>A <b>sure</b> or true sign of one's commitment.</i>
<b>sure to happen</b>	Reliable in operation or effect.
<b><u>unavoidable</u></b>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>An <b>unavoidable</b> accident.</i>
<b>unpreventable</b>	Not able to be prevented or avoided. <i>Until now this devastating disease has been <b>unpreventable</b>.</i>
