assured	Marked by assurance; exhibiting confidence. <i>An assured tenancy.</i>
bound to happen	Confined by bonds.
certain	Certain to occur destined or inevitable Benjamin Franklin. <i>Felt certain of success.</i>
ineliminable	Incapable of being removed or excluded from consideration. <i>An ineliminable feature of the human condition.</i>
ineluctable	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The ineluctable facts of history.</i>

<u>inevitable</u>	Certain to happen; unavoidable. <i>The inevitable changes of the seasons.</i>
inexorable	Impervious to pleas, persuasion, requests, reason. <i>Cynthia was inexorable she would have none of him.</i>
predestined	Established or prearranged unalterably. <i>It seemed predestined since the beginning of the world.</i>
<u>predetermined</u>	Set in advance. <i>A predetermined level of spending.</i>
preordained	(of an outcome or course of action) decided or determined beforehand; predestined. <i>A divinely preordained plan of creation.</i>
<u>sure</u>	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>A sure or true sign of one's commitment.</i>
sure to happen	Reliable in operation or effect.
<u>unavoidable</u>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>An unavoidable accident.</i>
unpreventable	Not able to be prevented or avoided. <i>Until now this devastating disease has been unpreventable.</i>
