**predestined** Established or prearranged unalterably.

*It seemed* **predestined** since the beginning of the world.

predetermined Set in advance.

A **predetermined** level of spending.

(of an outcome or course of action) decided or determined beforehand;

**preordained** predestined.

A divinely **preordained** plan of creation.

Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured.

A **sure** or true sign of one s commitment.

**sure to happen** Reliable in operation or effect.

unavoidable Impossible to avoid or evade.

An unavoidable accident.

The distribution desired.

**unpreventable** Not able to be prevented or avoided.

*Until now this devastating disease has been unpreventable.*
