### Definitions of "Inevitably" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “inevitably” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *As is certain to happen; unavoidably.*
- *As one would expect; predictably.*
- *By necessity.*
- *In such a manner as could not be otherwise.*



## Synonyms of "Inevitably" as an adverb (14 Words)

<b>as a matter of course</b>	To the same degree (often followed by `as.
<b>automatically</b>	Without conscious thought or attention; spontaneously. <i>The recovered weapons had been illegally modified to fire fully <b>automatically</b>.</i>
<b>by force of circumstance</b>	In reserve; not for immediate use.
<b><u>certainly</u></b>	Used to emphasize the speaker's belief that what is said is true. <i>She <b>certainly</b> is a hard worker.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>
<b>incontrovertibly</b>	In an obvious and provable manner.
<b>ineluctably</b>	By necessity.
<b>inescapably</b>	In a way that cannot be avoided or ignored; undeniably. <i>The situation slid <b>inescapably</b> toward disaster.</i>
<b><u>naturally</u></b>	In a normal manner; without exaggeration or effort. <i>He was <b>naturally</b> lazy.</i>
<b><u>necessarily</u></b>	As a highly likely consequence. <i>The prognosis can <b>necessarily</b> be only an educated guess.</i>
<b>needs</b>	Of necessity. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<b><u>surely</u></b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>The results are <b>surely</b> encouraging.</i>
<b>unavoidably</b>	In a way that cannot be avoided, prevented, or ignored. <i>The book becomes perhaps <b>unavoidably</b> slightly repetitive.</i>
<b><u>undoubtedly</u></b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Inevitably" as an adverb

- *Inevitably some details are already out of date.*
- *War inevitably has casualties.*
- *Inevitably, the phone started to ring just as we sat down.*



## Associations of "Inevitably" (30 Words)

<b>accountability</b>	The fact or condition of being accountable; responsibility. <i>Lack of <b>accountability</b> has corroded public respect for business and political leaders.</i>
<b>always</b>	At all times; on all occasions. <i>She will <b>always</b> be missed.</i>
<b><u>coincide</u></b>	Correspond in nature; tally. <i>The two events <b>coincided</b>.</i>
<b>compel</b>	Force somebody to do something. <i>His striking appearance <b>compelled</b> attention.</i>

<b>elements</b>	Violent or severe weather viewed as caused by the action of the four elements. <i>They felt the full fury of the <b>elements</b>.</i>
<b>ensure</b>	Make certain that (something) will occur or be the case. <i>Legislation to <b>ensure</b> equal opportunities for all.</i>
<b>essential</b>	Of the greatest importance. <i>The <b>essentials</b> of the good life.</i>
<b>impel</b>	Drive, force, or urge (someone) to do something. <i>Vital energies <b>impel</b> him in unforeseen directions.</i>
<b>indispensability</b>	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<b><u>indispensable</u></b>	Absolutely necessary. <i>Foods <b>indispensable</b> to good nutrition.</i>
<b><u>inevitable</u></b>	Invariably occurring or appearing. <i>By the morning he had accepted the <b>inevitable</b>.</i>
<b><u>integral</u></b>	The result of a mathematical integration $F(x)$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF = f(x) dx$ . <i>Systematic training should be <b>integral</b> to library management.</i>
<b>meaningful</b>	Communicating something that is not directly expressed. <i>A <b>meaningful</b> explanation.</i>
<b><u>must</u></b>	Be obliged to; should (expressing necessity). <i>You <b>must</b> try some of this fish.</i>
<b><u>necessarily</u></b>	In an essential manner. <i>Such expenses are <b>necessarily</b> incurred.</i>
<b>necessary</b>	(of a concept, statement, etc.) inevitably resulting from the nature of things, so that the contrary is impossible. <i>The <b>necessary</b> consequences of one's actions.</i>
<b>necessity</b>	A situation enforcing a certain course of action. <i>A good book is a <b>necessity</b> when travelling.</i>
<b>need</b>	Have need of. <i>Lest you even more than <b>needs</b> embitter our parting.</i>
<b>needs</b>	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must <b>needs</b> by objective.</i>
<b>obligate</b>	Require or compel (someone) to undertake a legal or moral duty. <i>The money must be <b>obligated</b> within 30 days.</i>
<b>obligatory</b>	Morally or legally constraining or binding. <i>He made all the <b>obligatory</b> apologies.</i>

<b>perforce</b>	By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b><u>prerequisite</u></b>	Required as a prior condition. <i>Latin was a <b>prerequisite</b> for admission.</i>
<b>request</b>	A formal message requesting something that is submitted to an authority. <i>Human intelligence which is in constant <b>request</b> in a family.</i>
<b>require</b>	Require as useful just or proper. <i>Success usually <b>requires</b> hard work.</i>
<b>required</b>	Required by rule. <i>The corset the garment that ensured the <b>required</b> female shape.</i>
<b>requisite</b>	Made necessary by particular circumstances or regulations. <i>The application will not be processed until the <b>requisite</b> fee is paid.</i>
<b><u>unavoidable</u></b>	Not able to be avoided, prevented, or ignored; inevitable. <i>An <b>unavoidable</b> accident.</i>
<b><u>unconditional</u></b>	Not conditional. <i><b>Unconditional</b> surrender.</i>
<b><u>vital</u></b>	Urgently needed; absolutely necessary. <i>A <b>vital</b> living organism.</i>
