Synonyms of "Inevitably" as an adverb (14 Words)

as a matter of course	To the same degree (often followed by `as. Without conscious thought or attention; spontaneously. <i>The recovered weapons had been illegally modified to fire fully automatically.</i>
automatically	
by force of circumstance	In reserve; not for immediate use.
<u>certainly</u>	Used to emphasize the speaker's belief that what is said is true. <i>She certainly is a hard worker.</i>
definitely	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>I shall definitely be at the airport to meet you.</i>
incontrovertibly	In an obvious and provable manner.
ineluctably	By necessity.
inescapably	In a way that cannot be avoided or ignored; undeniably. <i>The situation slid inescapably toward disaster.</i>
<u>naturally</u>	In a normal manner; without exaggeration or effort. <i>He was naturally lazy.</i>
<u>necessarily</u>	As a highly likely consequence. <i>The prognosis can necessarily be only an educated guess.</i>
needs	Of necessity. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>
<u>surely</u>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>The results are surely encouraging.</i>
unavoidably	In a way that cannot be avoided, prevented, or ignored. <i>The book becomes perhaps unavoidably slightly repetitive.</i>
<u>undoubtedly</u>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are undoubtedly guilty.</i>



Usage Examples of "Inevitably" as an adverb

- *Inevitably some details are already out of date.*
- *War inevitably has casualties.*
- *Inevitably, the phone started to ring just as we sat down.*

accountability	The fact or condition of being accountable; responsibility. <i>Lack of accountability has corroded public respect for business and political leaders.</i>
always	At all times; on all occasions. <i>She will always be missed.</i>
<u>coincide</u>	Correspond in nature; tally. <i>The two events coincided.</i>
compel	Force somebody to do something. <i>His striking appearance compelled attention.</i>

elements	Violent or severe weather viewed as caused by the action of the four elements. <i>They felt the full fury of the elements.</i>
ensure	Make certain that (something) will occur or be the case. <i>Legislation to ensure equal opportunities for all.</i>
essential	Of the greatest importance. <i>The essentials of the good life.</i>
impel	Drive, force, or urge (someone) to do something. <i>Vital energies impel him in unforeseen directions.</i>
indispensability	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<u>indispensable</u>	Absolutely necessary. <i>Foods indispensable to good nutrition.</i>
<u>inevitable</u>	Invariably occurring or appearing. <i>By the morning he had accepted the inevitable.</i>
<u>integral</u>	The result of a mathematical integration $F(x)$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF = f(x) dx$. <i>Systematic training should be integral to library management.</i>
meaningful	Communicating something that is not directly expressed. <i>A meaningful explanation.</i>
<u>must</u>	Be obliged to; should (expressing necessity). <i>You must try some of this fish.</i>
<u>necessarily</u>	In an essential manner. <i>Such expenses are necessarily incurred.</i>
necessary	(of a concept, statement, etc.) inevitably resulting from the nature of things, so that the contrary is impossible. <i>The necessary consequences of one's actions.</i>
necessity	A situation enforcing a certain course of action. <i>A good book is a necessity when travelling.</i>
need	Have need of. <i>Lest you even more than needs embitter our parting.</i>
needs	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>
obligate	Require or compel (someone) to undertake a legal or moral duty. <i>The money must be obligated within 30 days.</i>
obligatory	Morally or legally constraining or binding. <i>He made all the obligatory apologies.</i>

perforce	By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<u>prerequisite</u>	Required as a prior condition. <i>Latin was a prerequisite for admission.</i>
request	A formal message requesting something that is submitted to an authority. <i>Human intelligence which is in constant request in a family.</i>
require	Require as useful just or proper. <i>Success usually requires hard work.</i>
required	Required by rule. <i>The corset the garment that ensured the required female shape.</i>
requisite	Made necessary by particular circumstances or regulations. <i>The application will not be processed until the requisite fee is paid.</i>
<u>unavoidable</u>	Not able to be avoided, prevented, or ignored; inevitable. <i>An unavoidable accident.</i>
<u>unconditional</u>	Not conditional. <i>Unconditional surrender.</i>
<u>vital</u>	Urgently needed; absolutely necessary. <i>A vital living organism.</i>
