

Without conscious thought or attention; spontaneously.

automatically The recovered weapons had been illegally modified to fire fully

automatically.

by force of circumstance In reserve; not for immediate use.

Used to emphasize the speaker's belief that what is said is true.

She certainly is a hard worker.

definitelyWithout question and beyond doubt.

I shall **definitely** be at the airport to meet you.

incontrovertibly In an obvious and provable manner.

ineluctably By necessity.

inescapablyIn a way that cannot be avoided or ignored; undeniably.

The situation slid **inescapably** toward disaster.

naturally

In a normal manner; without exaggeration or effort.

He was **naturally** lazy.

necessarily As a highly likely consequence.

The prognosis can **necessarily** be only an educated guess.

Of necessity.

needs We must needs by objective.

Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for

surely surely.

The results are **surely** encouraging.

unavoidably

In a way that cannot be avoided, prevented, or ignored.

The book becomes perhaps **unavoidably** slightly repetitive.

undoubtedly Without doubt; certainly.

They are **undoubtedly** guilty.
