economical	Using no more of something than is necessary. <i>He was economical in all areas of life.</i>
giveaway	(of prices) very low. <i>Small giveaway mannerisms.</i>
keenly priced	Very good.
low-cost	That you have the financial means for.
low-priced	That you have the financial means for.
marked down	Strongly marked; easily noticeable.
on special offer	First and most important.
reasonable	Based on good sense. <i>Man is by nature reasonable.</i>
reduced	Well below normal (especially in price).
rock-bottom	Well below normal (especially in price).

<u>affordable</u>	That you have the financial means for. <i>Affordable homes.</i>
<u>bargain</u>	Be prepared for; expect. <i>He made a bargain with the devil.</i>
chaffer	Haggling about the price of something. <i>I chaffered in the bazaars for objects I wanted.</i>
cheap	Of very poor quality; flimsy. <i>A cheap trick.</i>
cheaply	In a stingy manner. <i>Some people forgive too cheaply.</i>
coupon	Of a consumer collect and use coupons or vouchers offering discounts on goods or services. <i>The stock carries a 10 per cent coupon.</i>

discount	Interest on an annual basis deducted in advance on a loan. <i>Rail commuters get a discount on season tickets.</i>
economical	Giving good value or return in relation to the money, time, or effort expended. <i>A small economical car.</i>
frugal	Avoiding waste. <i>I m a bit too frugal to splash out on designer clothes.</i>
gratis	Without charge; free. <i>A monthly programme was issued gratis.</i>
haggle	An instance of intense argument (as in bargaining). <i>Let s not haggle over a few dollars.</i>
meagerly	Deficient in amount or quality or extent. <i>These voices are meagerly represented at the conference.</i>
miser	A stingy hoarder of money and possessions often living miserably. <i>A typical miser he hid his money in the house in various places.</i>
parsimony	Extreme stinginess. <i>A great tradition of public design has been shattered by government parsimony.</i>
rebate	Pay back a sum of money as a rebate. <i>The scheme eases the move to the council tax by giving rebates in the first year.</i>
redemptive	Acting to save someone from error or evil. <i>Redemptive or redeeming love.</i>
rescue	Denoting or relating to a domestic animal that has been removed from a situation of abuse or neglect by a welfare organization. <i>Firemen rescued a man trapped in the river.</i>
save	Save from ruin destruction or harm. <i>The statement was made to save the government some embarrassment.</i>
saving	An economy of or reduction in money, time, or another resource. <i>Innovative money saving ideas for students.</i>
schlock	Merchandise that is shoddy or inferior. <i>Mass produced schlock.</i>
scrimp	Subsist on a meager allowance. <i>Scratch and scrimp.</i>
shoddy	Cheap and shoddy Judith Crist. <i>Shoddy business practices.</i>
skimp	Limit in quality or quantity. <i>She wore a yellow skimp.</i>

- sparing** Avoiding waste.
***Sparing** in their use of heat and light.*
- sparingly** To a meager degree or in a meager manner.
*The sharply flavoured leaves should be used **sparingly**.*
- tacky** (of a glutinous liquid such as paint) not completely dried and slightly sticky to the touch.
*The paint was still **tacky**.*
- thrift** The quality of using money and other resources carefully and not wastefully.
*The values of **thrift** and self reliance.*
- thrifty** Prosperous.
*He had been brought up to be **thrifty** and careful.*
- tightwad** A mean or miserly person.
*He is a notorious **tightwad**.*
