Associations of "Inextricably" (30 Words)

<u>affiliated</u>	Being joined in close association. <i>Affiliated clubs.</i>
attached	Joined, fastened, or connected to something. <i>A science policy agency attached to the Council of Ministers.</i>
<u>bind</u>	Provide with a binding. <i>The Chinese would bind the feet of their women.</i>
bond	Criminal law money that must be forfeited by the bondsman if an accused person fails to appear in court for trial. <i>English bond.</i>
<u>closely</u>	In a collective or unified way. <i>The students had to answer questions closely related to what they just learned.</i>
connect	Connect fasten or put together two or more pieces. <i>Can you connect the two loudspeakers.</i>
connected	Joined or linked together. <i>First check to see whether the appliance is connected.</i>
connection	A relationship in which a person or thing is linked or associated with something else. <i>He had connections in the music industry.</i>
<u>correlated</u>	Mutually related.
correlative	Expressing a reciprocal or complementary relation. <i>Rights whether moral or legal can involve correlative duties.</i>
corresponding	Conforming in every respect. <i>All rights carry with them corresponding responsibilities.</i>
embroil	Force into some kind of situation, condition, or course of action. <i>The film s about a journalist who becomes embroiled with a nightclub owner.</i>

entangle	Entrap. <i>Fish attempt to swim through the mesh and become entangled.</i>
included	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>The included check.</i>
interconnect	Cause to be interconnected or interwoven. <i>The bones are interconnected via the muscle.</i>
<u>interdependent</u>	(of two or more people or things) dependent on each other. <i>We in Europe are all increasingly interdependent.</i>
interlinear	(of a book) having the same text in different languages printed on alternate lines. <i>A Greek English interlinear New Testament.</i>
intimately	In a way that involves a close link or relationship. <i>The two phenomena are intimately connected.</i>
<u>involvement</u>	The fact or condition of being involved with or participating in something. <i>There was additional involvement of the liver and spleen.</i>
knot	Make into knots make knots out of. <i>His stomach was in knots.</i>
<u>link</u>	The means of connection between things linked in series. <i>The walls are held together with metal links placed in the wet mortar during construction.</i>
linked	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
nexus	A connected group or series. <i>A nexus of ideas.</i>
ravel	Untangle or unravel something. <i>A ravel of knitting.</i>
related	Connected by kinship, common origin, or marriage. <i>Income related benefits.</i>
<u>relatively</u>	Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite. <i>The situation is relatively calm now.</i>
<u>tangle</u>	Tangle or complicate. <i>A ploy to tangle matters even further.</i>
<u>tie</u>	Unite musical notes by a tie. <i>It is important that we keep family ties strong.</i>
underbrush	The brush (small trees and bushes and ferns etc.) growing beneath taller trees in a wood or forest.

web

Construct or form a web as if by weaving.
*Tangled in a **web** of cloth.*
