- *Possessed with an intense but short-lived passion or admiration for someone.*
- *Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness.*



## Synonyms of "Infatuated" as an adjective (9 Words)

### besotted

Intoxicated; drunk.

*He became **besotted** with a local barmaid.*

### enamored

Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness.

*Narcissus was a beautiful Greek youth who became **enamored** of his own reflection.*

**hopelessly in love** Certain to fail.

**in love** Directed or bound inward.

### **obsessed**

Influenced or controlled by a powerful force such as a strong emotion.

*Was absolutely **obsessed** with the girl.*

### smitten

(used in combination) affected by something overwhelming.

*Conscience **smitten**.*

### **soft on**

Soft and mild; not harsh or stern or severe.

**taken**

Be affected with an indisposition.  
A smile **taken** as consent.



**Usage Examples of "Infatuated" as an adjective**

- *He was infatuated with her.*
- *An infatuated teenager.*



## Associations of "Infatuated" (30 Words)

<b>adoring</b>	Showing adoration. <i><b>Adoring</b> grandparents.</i>
<b>affection</b>	A positive feeling of liking. <i>He had trouble expressing the <b>affection</b> he felt.</i>
<b><u>affectionate</u></b>	Readily feeling or showing fondness or tenderness. <i>His <b>affectionate</b> nature.</i>
<b>amatory</b>	Expressive of or exciting sexual love or romance. <i>His <b>amatory</b> exploits.</i>
<b>amorous</b>	Expressive of or exciting sexual love or romance. <i>She rejected his <b>amorous</b> advances.</i>
<b>attached</b>	Fond and affectionate. <i>He was <b>attached</b> to Military Intelligence.</i>

<b>beautiful</b>	Of a very high standard; excellent. <i>A <b>beautiful</b> party.</i>
<b>beauty</b>	A beautiful woman. <i><b>Beauty</b> treatment.</i>
<b>benediction</b>	The utterance of a blessing, especially at the end of a religious service. <i>He said the <b>benediction</b>.</i>
<b>caring</b>	Displaying kindness and concern for others. <i>A <b>caring</b> and invaluable friend.</i>
<b>cherish</b>	Hold (something) dear. <i>He needed a woman he could <b>cherish</b>.</i>
<b>decorous</b>	According with custom or propriety. <i>The tete a tete was <b>decorous</b> in the extreme.</i>
<b>delicate</b>	A delicate fabric or garment. <i>Owls have a <b>delicate</b> balance with their habitat.</i>
<b>doting</b>	Extremely and uncritically fond of someone; adoring. <i>Deceiving her preoccupied and <b>doting</b> husband with a young captain.</i>
<u><a href="#">enamored</a></u>	Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness. <i>Narcissus was a beautiful Greek youth who became <b>enamored</b> of his own reflection.</i>
<b>enchantingly</b>	In a bewitching manner.
<u><a href="#">fond</a></u>	(of a hope or belief) foolishly optimistic; naive. <i><b>Fond</b> of his nephew.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	An attractive woman. <i>How <b>lovely</b> to see you.</i>
<b>loving</b>	Feeling or showing love or great care. <i><b>Loving</b> glances.</i>
<b>mawkish</b>	Effusively or insincerely emotional. <i>A <b>mawkish</b> ode to parenthood.</i>
<b>melodrama</b>	Behaviour or events that resemble melodrama. <i>What little is known of his early life is cloaked in <b>melodrama</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">obsess</a></u>	Be preoccupied with something. <i>He was <b>obsessed</b> with the idea of revenge.</i>
<u><a href="#">rendezvous</a></u>	Meet at a rendezvous. <i>You d be welcome to use this place as a <b>rendezvous</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">romantic</a></u>	Relating to or denoting the artistic and literary movement of romanticism. <i>The <b>romantic</b> tradition.</i>

- sentimental** Given to or marked by sentiment or sentimentality.  
***Sentimental** soap operas.*
- sentimentality** Extravagant or affected feeling or emotion.  
*There are passages which verge on **sentimentality**.*
- smitten** (used in combination) affected by something overwhelming.  
*Conscience **smitten**.*
- stun** Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief.  
*The news **stunned** her.*
- tender** Make a tender of in legal settlements.  
*A **tender** mother.*
- tryst** A secret rendezvous (especially between lovers).  
*A moonlight **tryst**.*
