- Contaminate (air, water, etc.) with harmful organisms.
- Affect with a virus.
- Contaminate with a disease or microorganism.
- Affect in a contagious way.

measles followed by a rash; occurs primarily in children.

A severe case of the **measles**.

pandemic An outbreak of a pandemic disease.

A pandemic outbreak of malaria.

pathogen Any disease-producing agent (especially a virus or bacterium or other

microorganism.

A serious sometimes fatal infection of rodents caused by Yersinia pestis and

accidentally transmitted to humans by the bite of a flea that has bitten an

infected animal.

Many **pest**s have developed resistance to the common **pest**icides.

pestilence A fatal epidemic disease, especially bubonic plague.

Neither prayers nor demonstrations halted the advance of the **pestilence**.

A contagious bacterial disease characterized by fever and delirium typically

with the formation of buboes bubonic plague and sometimes infection of the

lungs pneumonic plague.

A **plague** of locusts.

An acute contagious viral disease, with fever and pustules that usually leave

permanent scars. It was effectively eradicated through vaccination by 1979.

tuberculosis An infectious bacterial disease characterized by the growth of nodules

(tubercles) in the tissues, especially the lungs.

A highly infectious disease of rodents (especially rabbits and squirrels) and

tularemia sometimes transmitted to humans by ticks or flies or by handling infected

animals.

vaccine A program designed to detect computer viruses and inactivate them.

There is no **vaccine** against the virus.

(of an image, video, piece of information, etc.) circulated rapidly and widely

virus An infection or disease caused by a virus.
