According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “infinity” as a noun can have the following definitions:

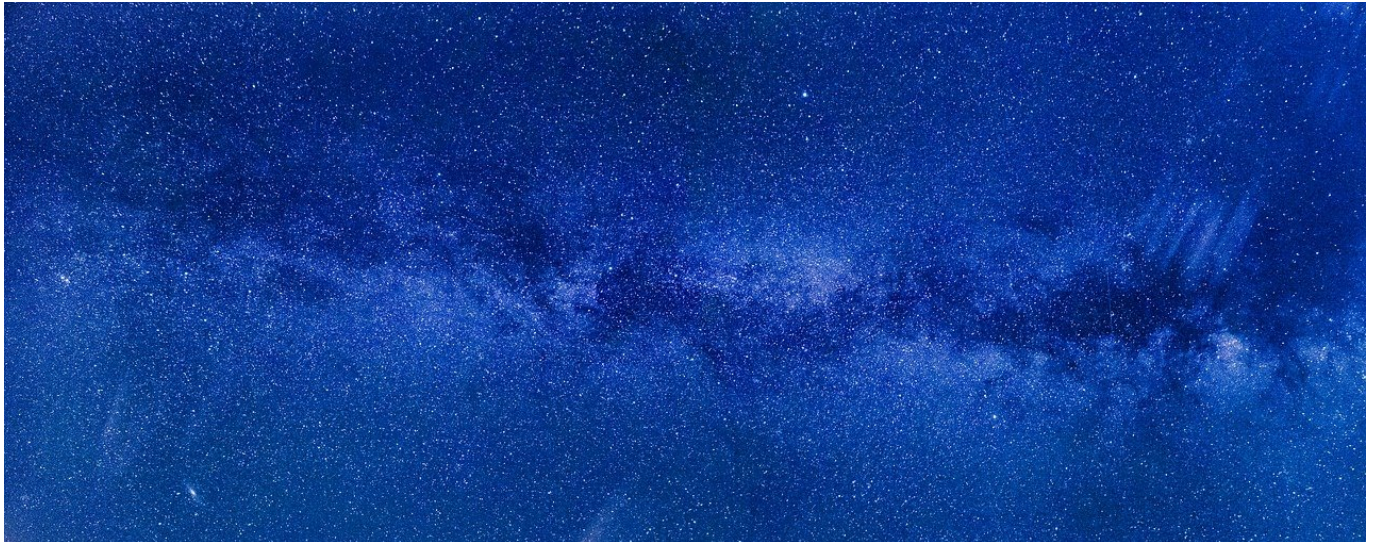
- *A point in space or time that is or seems infinitely distant.*
- *The state or quality of being infinite.*
- *An infinite or very great number or amount.*
- *Time without end.*
- *A number greater than any assignable quantity or countable number (symbol.*



## Synonyms of "Infinity" as a noun (16 Words)

<b>abundance</b>	The property of a more than adequate quantity or supply. <i>Estimates of the <b>abundance</b> of harp seals.</i>
<b>boundlessness</b>	The quality of being infinite; without bound or limit.
<b>endlessness</b>	The property of being (or seeming to be) without end.
<b>eternity</b>	Time without end. <i>Their love was sealed for <b>eternity</b>.</i>
<b>extensiveness</b>	Large or extensive in breadth or importance or comprehensiveness. <i>The very <b>extensiveness</b> of his power was a temptation to abuse it.</i>
<b>host</b>	A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers. <i>Your <b>host</b> is Stuart Macmillan.</i>
<b>immensity</b>	The extremely large size, scale, or extent of something. <i>I have no illusions about the <b>immensity</b> of this task.</i>
<b>infinite number</b>	The unlimited expanse in which everything is located.
<b>infiniteness</b>	The quality of being infinite; without bound or limit.
<b>infinitude</b>	The state or quality of being infinite or having no limit. <i>The <b>infinitude</b> of the universe.</i>

<b>limitlessness</b>	The quality of being infinite; without bound or limit.
<b>mass</b>	A sequence of prayers constituting the Christian Eucharistic rite. <i>Multiply the <b>mass</b> of the payload by the distance travelled.</i>
<b>multitude</b>	The mass of ordinary people without power or influence. <i>A <b>multitude</b> of TV antennas.</i>
<b>profusion</b>	The property of being extremely abundant. <i>The beautiful pink foxgloves growing in <b>profusion</b> among the ferns.</i>
<b>vastness</b>	Very great extent or size; immensity. <i>Brian was overwhelmed by the <b>vastness</b> of the occasion.</i>
<b>wealth</b>	An abundance of valuable possessions or money. <i>She has a <b>wealth</b> of talent.</i>

<u><a href="#">ceaseless</a></u>	Constant and unending. <i>The <b>ceaseless</b> thunder of surf.</i>
<u><a href="#">countless</a></u>	Too many to be counted; very many. <i><b>Countless</b> hours.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Infinitely great in number. <i><b>Endless</b> loop cassette tapes.</i>
<u><a href="#">eternal</a></u>	Lasting or existing forever; without end. <i>The wait seemed <b>eternal</b>.</i>

<b>finite</b>	Bounded or limited in magnitude or spatial or temporal extent. <i>Every computer has a <b>finite</b> amount of memory.</i>
<u><a href="#">forever</a></u>	For a limitless time- P.P.Bliss. <i>We had to wait <b>forever</b> and a day.</i>
<b>illimitable</b>	Without limits or an end. <i>The <b>illimitable</b> human capacity for evil.</i>
<u><a href="#">immeasurable</a></u>	Beyond calculation or measure. <i><b>Immeasurable</b> suffering.</i>
<u><a href="#">immortal</a></u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the <b>immortals</b> of soccer.</i>
<b>immortality</b>	Perpetual life after death. <i>Occasionally a guide book has achieved <b>immortality</b>.</i>
<b>inexhaustible</b>	Incapable of being entirely consumed or used up. <i>His <b>inexhaustible</b> energy.</i>
<u><a href="#">infinite</a></u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The boundless regions of the <b>infinite</b>.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<u><a href="#">limitless</a></u>	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent. <i>A <b>limitless</b> supply of money.</i>

<b><u>longevity</u></b>	Long life. <i>The greater <b>longevity</b> of women compared with men.</i>
<b>measureless</b>	Having no bounds or limits; unlimited. <i>Otto had <b>measureless</b> charm.</i>
<b><u>myriad</u></b>	A countless or extremely great number of people or things. <i>He faced a <b>myriad</b> of details.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Consisting of many members. <i>She had complained to the council on <b>numerous</b> occasions.</i>
<b>omniscience</b>	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>The notion of divine <b>omniscience</b>.</i>
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	A series of waves in the hair made by applying heat and chemicals. <i>Damage was not thought to be <b>permanent</b>.</i>
<b>permanently</b>	In a way that lasts or continues without interruption; continually. <i>We need to be <b>permanently</b> vigilant.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>A <b>perpetual</b> secretary of the society.</i>
<b>renewable</b>	Capable of being renewed; replaceable. <i><b>Renewable</b> energy such as solar energy is theoretically inexhaustible.</i>
<b><u>timeless</u></b>	Unaffected by time. <i>Antiques add to the <b>timeless</b> atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
<b><u>unbounded</u></b>	Having or appearing to have no limits. <i>The possibilities are <b>unbounded</b>.</i>
<b><u>undying</u></b>	Never dying. <i>His <b>undying</b> fame.</i>
<b>unlimited</b>	Having no limits in range or scope. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not <b>unlimited</b>.</i>
