According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “infinity” as a noun can have the following definitions:

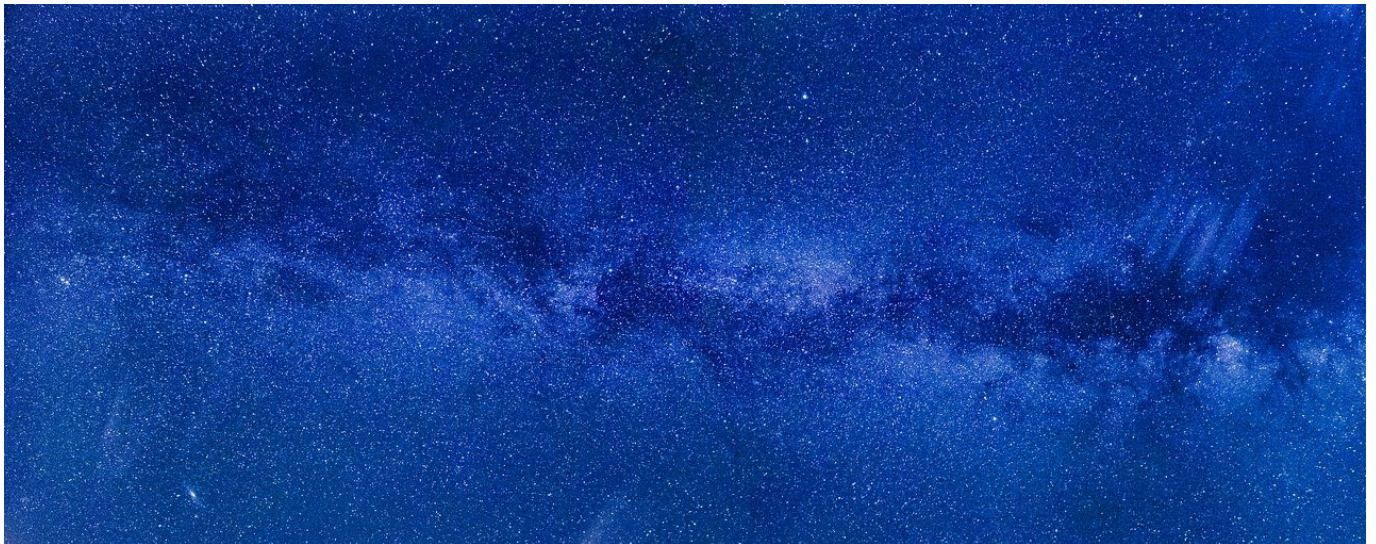
- *A point in space or time that is or seems infinitely distant.*
- *The state or quality of being infinite.*
- *An infinite or very great number or amount.*
- *Time without end.*
- *A number greater than any assignable quantity or countable number (symbol.*



Synonyms of "Infinity" as a noun (16 Words)

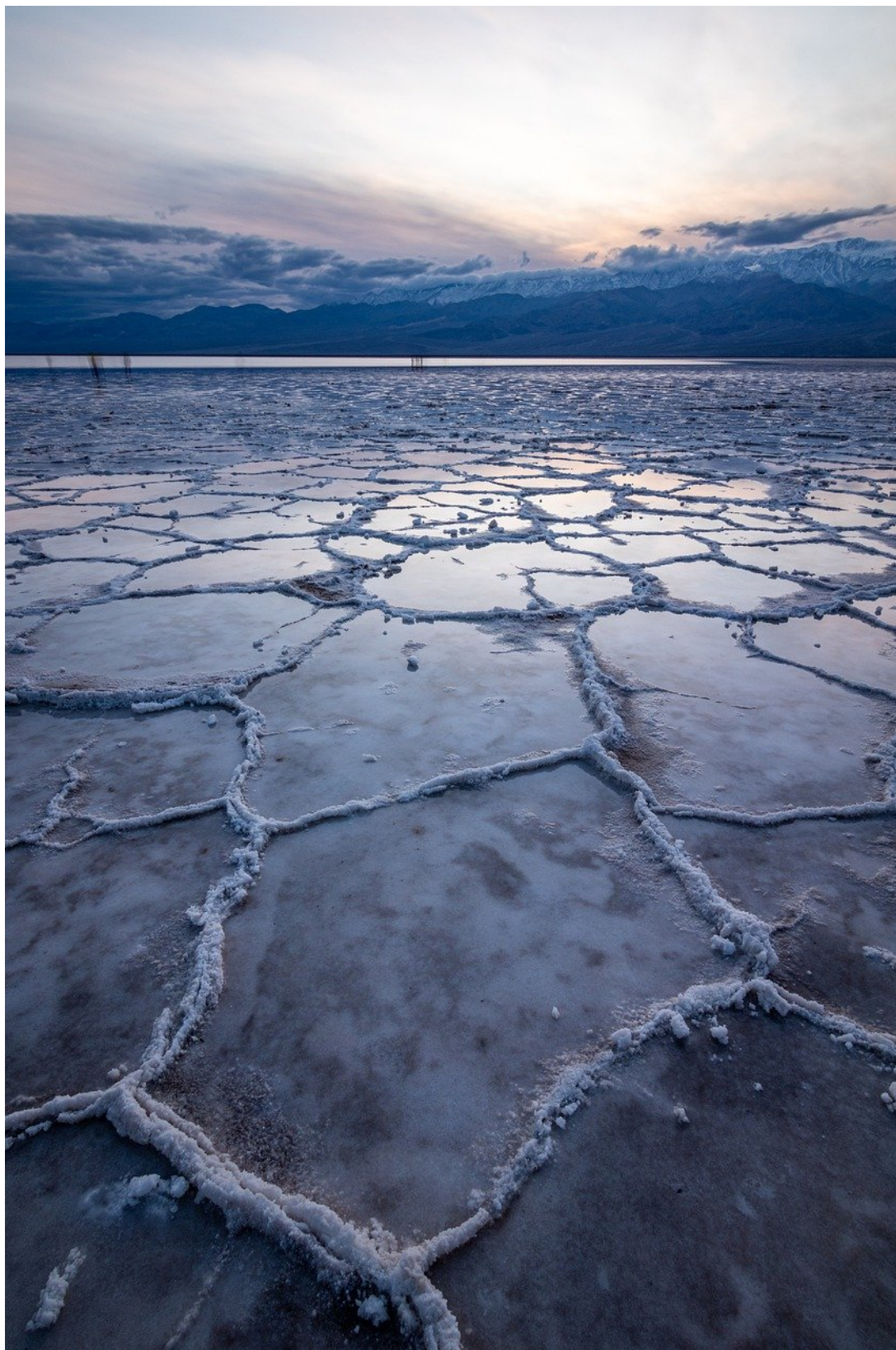
abundance	The property of a more than adequate quantity or supply. <i>Estimates of the abundance of harp seals.</i>
boundlessness	The quality of being infinite; without bound or limit.
endlessness	The property of being (or seeming to be) without end.
eternity	Time without end. <i>Their love was sealed for eternity.</i>
extensiveness	Large or extensive in breadth or importance or comprehensiveness. <i>The very extensiveness of his power was a temptation to abuse it.</i>
host	A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers. <i>Your host is Stuart Macmillan.</i>
immensity	The extremely large size, scale, or extent of something. <i>I have no illusions about the immensity of this task.</i>
infinite number	The unlimited expanse in which everything is located.
infiniteness	The quality of being infinite; without bound or limit.
infinitude	The state or quality of being infinite or having no limit. <i>The infinitude of the universe.</i>

limitlessness	The quality of being infinite; without bound or limit.
<u>mass</u>	A sequence of prayers constituting the Christian Eucharistic rite. <i>Multiply the mass of the payload by the distance travelled.</i>
<u>multitude</u>	The mass of ordinary people without power or influence. <i>A multitude of TV antennas.</i>
profusion	The property of being extremely abundant. <i>The beautiful pink foxgloves growing in profusion among the ferns.</i>
vastness	Very great extent or size; immensity. <i>Brian was overwhelmed by the vastness of the occasion.</i>
wealth	An abundance of valuable possessions or money. <i>She has a wealth of talent.</i>

- *The infinity of space.*
- *The transmission approaches 100% as the frequency tends to infinity.*
- *The lawns stretched into infinity.*
- *An infinity of combinations.*

boundless	Seemingly boundless in amount number degree or especially extent. <i>Enthusiasts who devote boundless energy to their hobby.</i>
<u>ceaseless</u>	Constant and unending. <i>The ceaseless thunder of surf.</i>
<u>countless</u>	Too many to be counted; very many. <i>Countless hours.</i>
endless	Infinitely great in number. <i>Endless loop cassette tapes.</i>
<u>eternal</u>	Lasting or existing forever; without end. <i>The wait seemed eternal.</i>
eternity	Time without end. <i>Their love was sealed for eternity.</i>
everlasting	A flower of the daisy family with a papery texture, retaining its shape and colour after being dried, especially a helichrysum. <i>An everlasting reminder of this evening.</i>
finite	Bounded or limited in magnitude or spatial or temporal extent. <i>Every computer has a finite amount of memory.</i>
<u>forever</u>	For a limitless time- P.P.Bliss. <i>We had to wait forever and a day.</i>
illimitable	Without limits or an end. <i>The illimitable human capacity for evil.</i>
<u>immeasurable</u>	Beyond calculation or measure. <i>Immeasurable suffering.</i>
<u>immortal</u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>He will always be one of the immortals of soccer.</i>
immortality	Perpetual life after death. <i>Occasionally a guide book has achieved immortality.</i>
inexhaustible	Incapable of being entirely consumed or used up. <i>His inexhaustible energy.</i>
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The boundless regions of the infinite.</i>
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
<u>limitless</u>	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent. <i>A limitless supply of money.</i>

<u>longevity</u>	Long life. <i>The greater longevity of women compared with men.</i>
measureless	Having no bounds or limits; unlimited. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
<u>myriad</u>	A countless or extremely great number of people or things. <i>He faced a myriad of details.</i>
numerous	Consisting of many members. <i>She had complained to the council on numerous occasions.</i>
omniscience	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>The notion of divine omniscience.</i>
<u>permanent</u>	A series of waves in the hair made by applying heat and chemicals. <i>Damage was not thought to be permanent.</i>
permanently	In a way that lasts or continues without interruption; continually. <i>We need to be permanently vigilant.</i>
perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>A perpetual secretary of the society.</i>
renewable	Capable of being renewed; replaceable. <i>Renewable energy such as solar energy is theoretically inexhaustible.</i>
<u>timeless</u>	Unaffected by time. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
<u>unbounded</u>	Having or appearing to have no limits. <i>The possibilities are unbounded.</i>
<u>undying</u>	Never dying. <i>His undying fame.</i>
unlimited	Having no limits in range or scope. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
