## **Inflamed as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Inflamed" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “inflamed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Adorned with tongues of flame.*
- *Lighted with red light as if with flames.*
- *(of a part of the body) red or swollen as a result of inflammation.*
- *(of strong feelings) provoked or intensified.*
- *Resulting from inflammation; hot and swollen and reddened.*



## Synonyms of "Inflamed" as an adjective (4 Words)

- ablaze** Keenly excited (especially sexually) or indicating excitement.  
*His eyes were **ablaze** with excitement.*
- puffed up** Gathered for protruding fullness.
- reddened** Reddened or suffused with or as if with blood from emotion or exertion.  
***Reddened** faces around the campfire.*
- swollen** Characteristic of false pride; having an exaggerated sense of self-importance.  
*So **swollen** by victory that he was unfit for normal duty.*



## Usage Examples of "Inflamed" as an adjective

- *Inflamed passions overrode reasoning.*
- *Inflamed eyes and lips.*
- *Eyes inflamed with crying.*
- *The inflamed clouds at sunset.*



## Associations of "Inflamed" (30 Words)

- aggravate** Exasperate or irritate.  
*This drug **aggravates** the pain.*
- agitative** Tending to agitate or move (something); involving agitation.
- anger** Fill someone with anger provoke anger in.  
*The news **angered** him.*
- arouse** Stop sleeping.  
*An ability to influence the audience and to **arouse** the masses.*

<b>bulb</b>	Lower or hindmost part of the brain continuous with spinal cord bulb is an old term for medulla oblongata. <i>The <b>bulb</b> of a syringe.</i>
<b>burn</b>	A mark left on something as a result of being burned. <i>A fire <b>burned</b> and crackled cheerfully in the grate.</i>
<b>combust</b>	Undergo combustion. <i>The oily rags <b>combusted</b> spontaneously.</i>
<b>combustion</b>	The process of burning something. <i>A large <b>combustion</b> plant.</i>
<b>enkindle</b>	Call forth (emotions, feelings, and responses). <i>The glare from its <b>enkindled</b> roof illumined its innermost recesses.</i>
<b>enrage</b>	Put into a rage; make violently angry. <i>The students were <b>enraged</b> at these new rules.</i>
<b>erupt</b>	Erupt or intensify suddenly. <i>Noise <b>erupted</b> from the drawing room.</i>
<b>exasperate</b>	Exasperate or irritate. <i>This futile process <b>exasperates</b> prison officers.</i>
<b>flammable</b>	Easily set on fire. <i>The use of highly <b>flammable</b> materials.</i>
<b>furnace</b>	An appliance fired by gas or oil in which air or water is heated to be circulated throughout a building in a heating system. <i>Her car was a <b>furnace</b>.</i>
<b>furor</b>	A sudden outburst (as of protest).
<b>heat</b>	A source or level of heat for cooking. <i>The fierce <b>heat</b> of the sun.</i>
<b>ignite</b>	Arouse or inflame (an emotion or situation). <i>The ostentatious way of living of the rich <b>ignites</b> the hatred of the poor.</i>
<b>incendiary</b>	An incendiary bomb or device. <i>Every bard was regarded as an <b>incendiary</b>.</i>
<b>incense</b>	The smoke or perfume of incense. <i><b>Incense</b> sticks.</i>
<b>infuriate</b>	Make (someone) extremely angry and impatient. <i>I was <b>infuriated</b> by your article.</i>
<b>inspire</b>	Draw in (air). <i>Their past record does not <b>inspire</b> confidence.</i>
<b>kindle</b>	Become impassioned or excited. <i>The young man <b>kindled</b> at once.</i>

<b><u>motivate</u></b>	Request (something) and present facts and arguments in support of one's request. <i>He said he would <b>motivate</b> funds to upgrade the food stalls.</i>
<b>offend</b>	Cause to feel resentment or indignation. <i>Those activities which <b>offend</b> against public order and decency.</i>
<b><u>provoke</u></b>	Evoke or provoke to appear or occur. <i>Rachel refused to be <b>provoked</b>.</i>
<b>pyrotechnic</b>	Relating to fireworks. <i>A <b>pyrotechnic</b> display.</i>
<b>rage</b>	Something that is desired intensely. <i>His face turned red with <b>rage</b>.</i>
<b>smoulder</b>	Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. <i>The <b>smoulder</b> suddenly became a blaze.</i>
<b>tinder</b>	Dry, flammable material, such as wood or paper, used for lighting a fire. <i>They slashed down the undergrowth for <b>tinder</b>.</i>
<b><u>torch</u></b>	Tall stalked very woolly mullein with densely packed yellow flowers ancient Greeks and Romans dipped the stalks in tallow for funeral torches. <i>The shops had been looted and <b>torched</b>.</i>
