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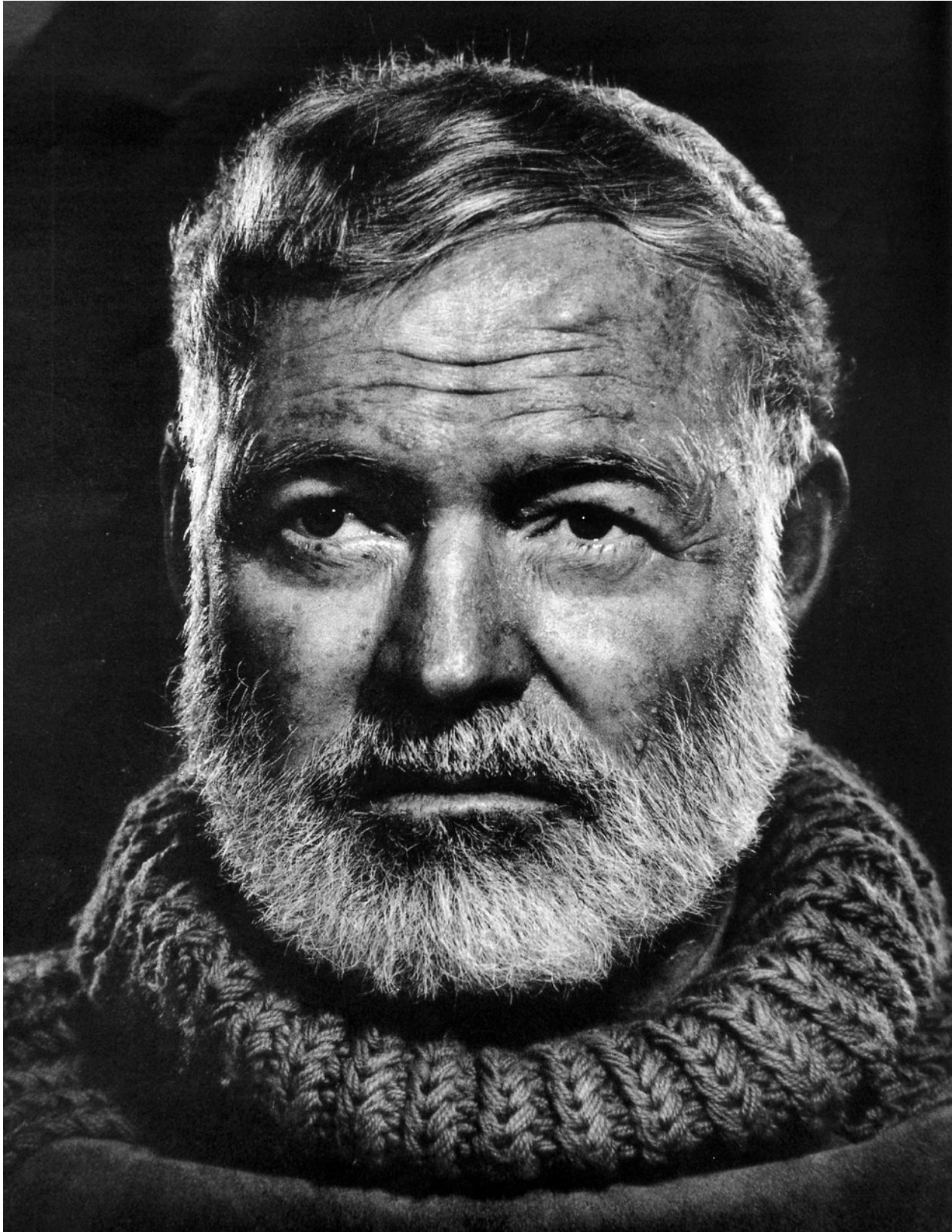

<b>authoritative</b>	(of a text) considered to be the best of its kind and unlikely to be improved upon. <i>Clear <b>authoritative</b> information and advice.</i>
<b>controlling</b>	Able to control or determine policy. <i>A <b>controlling</b> interest in the firm.</i>
<b>crucial</b>	Having crucial relevance. <i>A <b>crucial</b> election.</i>
<b>dominant</b>	Denoting the predominant species in a plant or animal community. <i>Red spruce is a <b>dominant</b> species in many types of forest.</i>
<b>important</b>	Important in effect or meaning. <i>The <b>important</b> questions of the day.</i>
<b>pivotal</b>	Of crucial importance in relation to the development or success of something else. <i>A <b>pivotal</b> event.</i>
<b>powerful</b>	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>The most <b>powerful</b> government in western Europe.</i>
<b>significant</b>	Rich in significance or implication. <i>A <b>significant</b> contribution.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>The competition was too <b>strong</b>.</i>

<b>authoritative</b>	Able to be trusted as being accurate or true; reliable. An <b>authoritative</b> source.
<b>creditable</b>	Worthy of often limited commendation. A very <b>creditable</b> 2 4 defeat.
<b>crucially</b>	With decisive or vital importance. Both movies are <b>crucially</b> dependent on the performance of the male lead.
<b>effect</b>	(of a law) having legal validity. The prime minister <b>effected</b> many policy changes.
<b>efficacy</b>	The ability to produce a desired or intended result. There is little information on the <b>efficacy</b> of this treatment.
<b>fame</b>	The state or quality of being widely honored and acclaimed. The song's success rocketed him to stardom and <b>fame</b> .
<b>holistic</b>	Characterized by the treatment of the whole person, taking into account mental and social factors, rather than just the symptoms of a disease.
<b>honored</b>	Having an illustrious reputation; respected.
<b>honour</b>	Accept (a bill) or pay (a cheque) when due. An <b>honours</b> degree in mathematics.
<b>important</b>	Important in effect or meaning. The speech had passion and more <b>important</b> compassion.
<b>influence</b>	Have and exert influence or effect. She was the most important <b>influence</b> in my life.
<b>lastingly</b>	In an enduring or permanent manner.
<b>methodical</b>	(of a person) orderly or systematic in thought or behaviour. A <b>methodical</b> approach to the evaluation of computer systems.
<b>mighty</b>	Extremely. My ears got cold <b>mighty</b> fast.
<b>potency</b>	Capacity to produce strong physiological or chemical effects. A myth of enormous <b>potency</b> .
<b>potent</b>	Having great power, influence, or effect. A <b>potent</b> toxin.
<b>powerful</b>	Possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. A <b>powerful</b> bomb.
<b>prestigious</b>	Having an illustrious reputation; respected. A <b>prestigious</b> academic post.
<b>reputable</b>	Having a good reputation. A <b>reputable</b> business.

<b>reputation</b>	A widespread belief that someone or something has a particular characteristic. <i>His knowledge of his subject earned him a <b>reputation</b> as an expert.</i>
<b>respected</b>	Receiving deferential regard. <i>A <b>respected</b> academic.</i>
<b>sinewy</b>	Consisting of tendons or resembling a tendon. <i>A short <b>sinewy</b> sunburnt man.</i>
<b>systemic</b>	Denoting the part of the circulatory system concerned with the transport of oxygen to and carbon dioxide from the body in general, especially as distinct from the pulmonary part concerned with the transport of oxygen from and carbon dioxide to the lungs. <i>The disease is localized rather than <b>systemic</b>.</i>
<b>telling</b>	Disclosing unintentionally something concealed. <i>A <b>telling</b> smile.</i>
<b>tycoon</b>	A title applied by foreigners to the shogun of Japan in power between 1857 and 1868. <i>A newspaper <b>tycoon</b>.</i>
<b>undeniably</b>	Used to emphasize that something cannot be denied or disputed. <i>Effective responsive government <b>undeniably</b> benefits businesses.</i>
<b>virile</b>	Having strength, energy, and a strong sex drive (typically used of a man). <i>He was a powerful <b>virile</b> man.</i>
