Infrequent as an Adjective

Definitions of "Infrequent" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “infrequent” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not frequent; not occurring regularly or at short intervals.*
- *Not occurring often; rare.*

Synonyms of "Infrequent" as an adjective (7 Words)

exceptional	Deviating widely from a norm of physical or mental ability; used especially of children below normal in intelligence. <i>A child of exceptional ability.</i>
few	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number. <i>A few more wagons than usual.</i>
few and far between	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number.
like gold dust	Conforming in every respect.
rare	Not widely known; especially valued for its uncommonness. <i>Rare patches of green in the desert.</i>

uncommon	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>He owed his greatest debt to his mother s uncommon character and ability.</i>
unusual	Not commonly encountered. <i>An unusual meteorite.</i>

Usage Examples of "Infrequent" as an adjective

- *Her visits were so infrequent.*
- *Infrequent outbursts of temper.*

Associations of "Infrequent" (30 Words)

abnormal	Much greater than the normal. <i>Abnormal ambition.</i>
anomalous	Deviating from the general or common order or type. <i>An anomalous situation.</i>
collectable	Able to be collected. <i>The auction attracted professional dealers trading in quality small collectables.</i>
<u>collectible</u>	Subject to or requiring payment especially as specified. <i>A collectible bill.</i>
curio	Something unusual — perhaps worthy of collecting. <i>They had such fun over the wonderful box of curios that Jack had sent from India.</i>
episodic	Of writing or narration; divided into or composed of episodes. <i>Episodic in his affections.</i>
exceptional	Unusual; not typical. <i>Late claims will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances.</i>
<u>hardly</u>	Scarcely (used to qualify a statement by saying that it is true to an insignificant degree). <i>I hardly think so.</i>
infrequently	Not many times. <i>He cooks but only infrequently.</i>
<u>intermittent</u>	Stopping and starting at irregular intervals. <i>Intermittent rain showers.</i>

irregular	A member of an irregular military force. <i>An irregular pair of jeans.</i>
occasional	(of furniture) made or adapted for use on a particular occasion or for infrequent use. <i>An occasional worker.</i>
occasionally	Sporadically and infrequently. <i>We met up occasionally for a drink.</i>
oddity	A strange or peculiar person or thing. <i>Realizing the oddity of the remark he retracted it.</i>
often	In many cases or instances. <i>How often do you have your hair cut.</i>
rare	Not widely known; especially valued for its uncommonness. <i>One of Britain's rarest birds the honey buzzard.</i>
rarefaction	A decrease in the density of something. <i>Opposed processes such as rarefaction and condensation.</i>
rarely	Remarkably well. <i>We rarely met.</i>
rareness	Noteworthy scarcity.
rarity	The state or quality of being rare. <i>To take the morning off was a rarity.</i>
scarce	Scarcely. <i>Would have scarce arrived before she would have found some excuse to leave.</i>
seldom	Not often. <i>A great but seldom pleasure.</i>
sometimes	On certain occasions or in certain cases but not always. <i>Sometimes I want to do things on my own.</i>
sparse	Scanty; in short supply. <i>Trees were sparse.</i>
sparsity	The property of being scanty or scattered; lacking denseness.
sporadic	Recurring in scattered and irregular or unpredictable instances. <i>A city subjected to sporadic bombing raids.</i>
sporadically	In a sporadic manner. <i>He worked sporadically at part time jobs.</i>
uncommon	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>An uncommon name.</i>

unpredictable Not able to be predicted; changeable.
*The **unpredictable** weather of the Scottish islands.*

unusual Not commonly encountered.
*A scene of **unusual** beauty.*
