## Infrequent as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Infrequent" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “infrequent” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not frequent; not occurring regularly or at short intervals.*
- *Not occurring often; rare.*

### Synonyms of "Infrequent" as an adjective (7 Words)

<b>exceptional</b>	Deviating widely from a norm of physical or mental ability; used especially of children below normal in intelligence. <i>A child of <b>exceptional</b> ability.</i>
<a href="#"><b>few</b></a>	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number. <i>A <b>few</b> more wagons than usual.</i>
<b>few and far between</b>	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number.
<b>like gold dust</b>	Conforming in every respect.
<a href="#"><b>rare</b></a>	Not widely known; especially valued for its uncommonness. <i><b>Rare</b> patches of green in the desert.</i>

<b>uncommon</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>He owed his greatest debt to his mother s <b>uncommon</b> character and ability.</i>
<b>unusual</b>	Not commonly encountered. <i>An <b>unusual</b> meteorite.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Infrequent" as an adjective

- *Her visits were so infrequent.*
- *Infrequent outbursts of temper.*

## Associations of "Infrequent" (30 Words)

<b>abnormal</b>	Much greater than the normal. <i><b>Abnormal</b> ambition.</i>
<b>anomalous</b>	Deviating from the general or common order or type. <i>An <b>anomalous</b> situation.</i>
<b>collectable</b>	Able to be collected. <i>The auction attracted professional dealers trading in quality small <b>collectables</b>.</i>
<u><b>collectible</b></u>	Subject to or requiring payment especially as specified. <i>A <b>collectible</b> bill.</i>
<b>curio</b>	Something unusual — perhaps worthy of collecting. <i>They had such fun over the wonderful box of <b>curios</b> that Jack had sent from India.</i>
<b>episodic</b>	Of writing or narration; divided into or composed of episodes. <i><b>Episodic</b> in his affections.</i>
<b>exceptional</b>	Unusual; not typical. <i>Late claims will only be accepted in <b>exceptional</b> circumstances.</i>
<u><b>hardly</b></u>	Scarcely (used to qualify a statement by saying that it is true to an insignificant degree). <i>I <b>hardly</b> think so.</i>
<b>infrequently</b>	Not many times. <i>He cooks but only <b>infrequently</b>.</i>
<u><b>intermittent</b></u>	Stopping and starting at irregular intervals. <i><b>Intermittent</b> rain showers.</i>

<u>irregular</u>	A member of an irregular military force. An <b>irregular</b> pair of jeans.
<b>occasional</b>	(of furniture) made or adapted for use on a particular occasion or for infrequent use. An <b>occasional</b> worker.
<u>occasionally</u>	Sporadically and infrequently. We met up <b>occasionally</b> for a drink.
<b>oddity</b>	A strange or peculiar person or thing. Realizing the <b>oddity</b> of the remark he retracted it.
<b>often</b>	In many cases or instances. How <b>often</b> do you have your hair cut.
<u>rare</u>	Not widely known; especially valued for its uncommonness. One of Britain's <b>rarest</b> birds the honey buzzard.
<b>rarefaction</b>	A decrease in the density of something. Opposed processes such as <b>rarefaction</b> and condensation.
<u>rarely</u>	Remarkably well. We <b>rarely</b> met.
<b>rareness</b>	Noteworthy scarcity.
<u>rarity</u>	The state or quality of being rare. To take the morning off was a <b>rarity</b> .
<u>scarce</u>	Scarcely. Would have <b>scarce</b> arrived before she would have found some excuse to leave.
<u>seldom</u>	Not often. A great but <b>seldom</b> pleasure.
<u>sometimes</u>	On certain occasions or in certain cases but not always. <b>Sometimes</b> I want to do things on my own.
<u>sparse</u>	Scanty; in short supply. Trees were <b>sparse</b> .
<b>sparsity</b>	The property of being scanty or scattered; lacking denseness.
<u>sporadic</u>	Recurring in scattered and irregular or unpredictable instances. A city subjected to <b>sporadic</b> bombing raids.
<b>sporadically</b>	In a sporadic manner. He worked <b>sporadically</b> at part time jobs.
<b>uncommon</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. An <b>uncommon</b> name.

**unpredictable** Not able to be predicted; changeable.  
*The **unpredictable** weather of the Scottish islands.*

**unusual** Not commonly encountered.  
*A scene of **unusual** beauty.*
