- Not occurring often; rare.

Synonyms of "Infrequent" as an adjective (7 Words)

exceptional	Deviating widely from a norm of physical or mental ability; used especially of children below normal in intelligence. A child of exceptional ability.
<u>few</u>	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number. A few more wagons than usual.
few and far between	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number.
like gold dust	Conforming in every respect.
rare	Not widely known; especially valued for its uncommonness. <i>Rare</i> patches of green in the desert.

unusual Not commonly encountered.
