### **Definitions of "Infuriating" as an adjective**

- *Extremely annoying or displeasing.*
- *Making one extremely angry and impatient.*



### Synonyms of "Infuriating" as an adjective (3 Words)

- exasperating** Extremely annoying or displeasing.  
*His cavalier curtness of manner was **exasperating**.*
- maddening** Extremely annoying.  
*She put the coins back with **maddening** slowness.*
- vexing** Causing annoyance, frustration, or worry.  
*The most **vexing** questions for policymakers.*



## Usage Examples of "Infuriating" as an adjective

- *Her infuriating indifference.*
- *That infuriating half-smile on his face.*



## Associations of "Infuriating" (30 Words)

<b>aggravate</b>	Make (a problem, injury, or offence) worse or more serious. <i>This drug <b>aggravates</b> the pain.</i>
<b>ambrosial</b>	Worthy of the gods. <i><b>Ambrosial</b> food.</i>
<b>anger</b>	Fill someone with anger provoke anger in. <i>He <b>angers</b> easily.</i>
<b><u>aroma</u></b>	A distinctive, typically pleasant smell. <i>The tantalizing <b>aroma</b> of fresh coffee.</i>
<b><u>aromatic</u></b>	An aromatic compound. <i>An <b>aromatic</b> organic compound.</i>
<b>burn</b>	Damage by burning with heat fire or radiation. <i>I <b>burned</b> myself on the stove.</i>

<b>crazy</b>	Possessed by inordinate excitement. <i><b>Crazy</b> about cars and racing.</i>
<b>enrage</b>	Make (someone) very angry. <i>The students were <b>enraged</b> at these new rules.</i>
<b>exacerbate</b>	Make (a problem, bad situation, or negative feeling) worse. <i>The strong pound has <b>exacerbated</b> the situation by making it much harder for UK companies to compete on price.</i>
<b>exasperate</b>	Exasperate or irritate. <i>This futile process <b>exasperates</b> prison officers.</i>
<b>fearful</b>	Extremely distressing. <i>He was in a <b>fearful</b> hurry.</i>
<b><u>fragrance</u></b>	A perfume or aftershave. <i>The <b>fragrance</b> of fresh ground coffee.</i>
<b>frankincense</b>	An aromatic gum resin obtained from various Arabian or East African trees; formerly valued for worship and for embalming and fumigation.
<b><u>fury</u></b>	A feeling of intense anger. <i>Rachel shouted beside herself with <b>fury</b>.</i>
<b>incense</b>	The smoke or perfume of incense. <i>The sharp lingering sweetness of <b>incense</b>.</i>
<b>inconvenient</b>	Not conveniently timed. <i>She telephoned frequently usually at <b>inconvenient</b> times.</i>
<b>inflame</b>	Become inflamed get sore. <i>His throat <b>inflamed</b>.</i>
<b><u>insane</u></b>	Extremely annoyed. <i>The peanut butter chocolate is <b>insane</b>.</i>
<b>ire</b>	A strong emotion; a feeling that is oriented toward some real or supposed grievance. <i>The plans provoked the <b>ire</b> of conservationists.</i>
<b><u>irritation</u></b>	The stimulation of an organism, cell, or organ to produce an active response. <i>Any food produced <b>irritation</b> of the stomach.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i><b>Mad</b> at his friend.</i>
<b>madden</b>	Drive (someone or something) insane. <i>His behavior is <b>maddening</b>.</i>
<b>musk</b>	A strong smelling reddish brown substance which is secreted by the male musk deer for scent marking and is an important ingredient in perfumery.

- nosegay** An arrangement of flowers that is usually given as a present.  
*A **nosegay** worn at the waist or bodice.*
- perfume** Apply perfume to.  
*Musk based **perfumes**.*
- rage** An interest followed with exaggerated zeal.  
*She couldn't hide the fear that **raged** within her.*
- sadden** Come to feel sad.  
*I was **saddened** to see their lack of commitment.*
- sandalwood** A perfume or incense derived from the sandalwood.
- scent** Impart a pleasant scent to.  
*She sprayed **scent** over her body.*
- worsen** Make or become worse.  
*Her condition **worsened** on the flight.*
