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Associations of "Inhabited" (30 Words)

abidance	The act of abiding (enduring without yielding).
abide	Dwell. <i>I said I would abide by their decision.</i>
abode	Any address at which you dwell more than temporarily. <i>Their right of abode in Britain.</i>
addressee	One to whom something is addressed. <i>The need to state clearly the addressees of reports.</i>
bide	Remain or stay somewhere. <i>How long must I bide here to wait for the answer.</i>
citizen	A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community. <i>The good citizens of Edinburgh.</i>
colonial	A house built in colonial style. <i>The house was a 1903 colonial.</i>
county	A sporting team playing for a county. <i>The county plans to build a new road.</i>
denizen	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>Denizens of the deep.</i>
domicile	Law the residence where you have your permanent home or principal establishment and to where whenever you are absent you intend to return every person is compelled to have one and only one domicile at a time. <i>His wife has a domicile of origin in Germany.</i>
dwell	Think moodily or anxiously about something. <i>Don't dwell on the past.</i>
dweller	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>The majority of urban dwellers live in small apartments.</i>
dwelling	Housing that someone is living in. <i>He built a modest dwelling near the pond.</i>

habitable	Suitable or good enough to live in. <i>The house should be habitable by Christmas.</i>
habitant	An inhabitant. <i>The habitant farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>
habitat	The type of environment in which an organism or group normally lives or occurs. <i>A marine habitat.</i>
habitation	Housing that someone is living in. <i>He studied the creation and inhabitation and demise of the colony.</i>
homestead	Settle land given by the government and occupy it as a homestead.
inhabitant	A person who inhabits a particular place.
lifelong	Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life. <i>From lifelong habit.</i>
live	Lead a certain kind of life live in a certain style. <i>The volcano is very much alive.</i>
living	People who are still living. <i>Save your pity for the living.</i>
mansion	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle Mansions.</i>
occupy	Occupy the whole of. <i>The young prince will soon occupy the throne.</i>
populate	Form the population of (a place). <i>The island is populated by scarcely 40 000 people.</i>
reside	Be situated. <i>The meaning of an utterance does not wholly reside in the semantic meaning.</i>
residence	A large and imposing house. <i>She took up residence in Paris.</i>
resident	A physician (especially an intern) who lives in a hospital and cares for hospitalized patients under the supervision of the medical staff of the hospital. <i>Resident mute swans and wintering Bewick s swans.</i>
stay	Fasten with stays. <i>Please stay the bloodshed.</i>
township	A new area being developed for residential or industrial use by speculators. <i>Township theatre.</i>
