Associations of "Inherently" (30 Words)

antenatal	Occurring or existing before birth. <i>Antenatal care.</i>
<u>born</u>	British nuclear physicist born in Germany honored for his contributions to quantum mechanics 1882 1970. <i>A German born philosopher.</i>
<u>congenital</u>	(of a person) having a particular trait from birth or by firmly established habit. <i>A congenital malformation of the heart.</i>
distaff	Of or concerning women. <i>Marriage is still the passport to distaff power.</i>
feminine	A feminine word or form. <i>A feminine ending.</i>
genetically	In a way that relates to genes or genetics. <i>Language varieties that are genetically related.</i>
immanent	Existing or operating within; inherent. <i>Ambition is immanent in human nature.</i>
inborn	Present at birth but not necessarily hereditary; acquired during fetal development. <i>People think doctors have inborn compassion.</i>
inherence	The state of inhering; the state of being a fixed characteristic. <i>The inherence of polysemy in human language.</i>
inherited	(of a quality, characteristic, or predisposition) derived genetically from one's parents or ancestors. <i>Inherited wealth.</i>
innate	Originating in the mind. <i>Her innate capacity for organization.</i>
<u>instinct</u>	(followed by `with') deeply filled or permeated. <i>Instinct told her not to ask the question.</i>

<u>intrinsic</u>	Belonging naturally; essential. <i>Intrinsic muscles.</i>
intuition	Instinctive knowing (without the use of rational processes). <i>He had an intuition that something had gone wrong.</i>
maternal	Characteristic of a mother. <i>My maternal grandmother.</i>
matriarch	A female head of a family or tribe. <i>In some cultures the mother proceeds to the status of a matriarch.</i>
<u>mutual</u>	A mutual building society or insurance company. <i>They cooperated as potentially mutual beneficiaries of the settlement.</i>
<u>nascent</u>	Being born or beginning. <i>A nascent insurgency.</i>
natal	Relating to the place or time of one's birth. <i>He was living in the south many miles from his natal city.</i>
<u>native</u>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e.g native bee. <i>The marigold is a native of southern Europe.</i>
<u>parent</u>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Policy considerations were determined largely by the parent company.</i>
parental	Relating to a person's parent or parents. <i>Parental leave.</i>
paternal	Belonging to or inherited from one's father. <i>A paternal aunt.</i>
paternity	The state of being a father. <i>Tests were conducted to determine paternity.</i>
<u>predisposition</u>	An inclination beforehand to interpret statements in a particular way. <i>Factors including genetic predisposition.</i>
pregnancy	The state of being pregnant; the period from conception to birth when a woman carries a developing fetus in her uterus. <i>The first weeks of pregnancy.</i>
uncle	The brother of your father or mother; the husband of your aunt. <i>He played uncle to lonely students.</i>
<u>visceral</u>	Relating to or affecting the viscera. <i>The voters visceral fear of change.</i>
within	Inside; indoors. <i>Enquire within.</i>
