## Associations of "Inherently" (30 Words)

<b>antenatal</b>	Occurring or existing before birth. <i><b>Antenatal</b> care.</i>
<b><u>born</u></b>	British nuclear physicist born in Germany honored for his contributions to quantum mechanics 1882 1970. <i>A German <b>born</b> philosopher.</i>
<b><u>congenital</u></b>	(of a person) having a particular trait from birth or by firmly established habit. <i>A <b>congenital</b> malformation of the heart.</i>
<b>distaff</b>	Of or concerning women. <i>Marriage is still the passport to <b>distaff</b> power.</i>
<b>feminine</b>	A feminine word or form. <i>A <b>feminine</b> ending.</i>
<b>genetically</b>	In a way that relates to genes or genetics. <i>Language varieties that are <b>genetically</b> related.</i>
<b>immanent</b>	Existing or operating within; inherent. <i>Ambition is <b>immanent</b> in human nature.</i>
<b>inborn</b>	Present at birth but not necessarily hereditary; acquired during fetal development. <i>People think doctors have <b>inborn</b> compassion.</i>
<b>inherence</b>	The state of inhering; the state of being a fixed characteristic. <i>The <b>inherence</b> of polysemy in human language.</i>
<b>inherited</b>	(of a quality, characteristic, or predisposition) derived genetically from one's parents or ancestors. <i><b>Inherited</b> wealth.</i>
<b>innate</b>	Originating in the mind. <i>Her <b>innate</b> capacity for organization.</i>
<b><u>instinct</u></b>	(followed by `with') deeply filled or permeated. <i><b>Instinct</b> told her not to ask the question.</i>

<b><u>intrinsic</u></b>	Belonging naturally; essential. <i><b>Intrinsic</b> muscles.</i>
<b>intuition</b>	Instinctive knowing (without the use of rational processes). <i>He had an <b>intuition</b> that something had gone wrong.</i>
<b>maternal</b>	Characteristic of a mother. <i>My <b>maternal</b> grandmother.</i>
<b>matriarch</b>	A female head of a family or tribe. <i>In some cultures the mother proceeds to the status of a <b>matriarch</b>.</i>
<b><u>mutual</u></b>	A mutual building society or insurance company. <i>They cooperated as potentially <b>mutual</b> beneficiaries of the settlement.</i>
<b><u>nascent</u></b>	Being born or beginning. <i>A <b>nascent</b> insurgency.</i>
<b>natal</b>	Relating to the place or time of one's birth. <i>He was living in the south many miles from his <b>natal</b> city.</i>
<b><u>native</u></b>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e.g native bee. <i>The marigold is a <b>native</b> of southern Europe.</i>
<b><u>parent</u></b>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Policy considerations were determined largely by the <b>parent</b> company.</i>
<b>parental</b>	Relating to a person's parent or parents. <i><b>Parental</b> leave.</i>
<b>paternal</b>	Belonging to or inherited from one's father. <i>A <b>paternal</b> aunt.</i>
<b>paternity</b>	The state of being a father. <i>Tests were conducted to determine <b>paternity</b>.</i>
<b><u>predisposition</u></b>	An inclination beforehand to interpret statements in a particular way. <i>Factors including genetic <b>predisposition</b>.</i>
<b>pregnancy</b>	The state of being pregnant; the period from conception to birth when a woman carries a developing fetus in her uterus. <i>The first weeks of <b>pregnancy</b>.</i>
<b>uncle</b>	The brother of your father or mother; the husband of your aunt. <i>He played <b>uncle</b> to lonely students.</i>
<b><u>visceral</u></b>	Relating to or affecting the viscera. <i>The voters <b>visceral</b> fear of change.</i>
<b>within</b>	Inside; indoors. <i>Enquire <b>within</b>.</i>
