- *Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically).*
- *Too numerous to be counted.*

Synonyms of "Innumerable" as an adjective (16 Words)

countless	Too numerous to be counted. <i>She d apologized countless times before.</i>
incalculable	Not able to be computed or enumerated. <i>Under the pressure of anxiety his temper became incalculable.</i>
infinite	Very great in amount or degree. <i>The infinite ingenuity of man.</i>
innumerable	Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically). <i>The oft quoted statement has been repeated innumerable times.</i>
manifold	Many and various. <i>The appeal of the crusade was manifold.</i>

multifarious	Having many aspects. <i>A vast multifarious organization.</i>
multitudinous	Consisting of or containing many individuals or elements. <i>Multitudinous rugs kept us warm.</i>
<u>myriad</u>	Countless or extremely great in number. <i>The myriad political scene.</i>
numberless	Too many to be counted; innumerable. <i>There are numberless questions to be asked.</i>
numerous	Consisting of many members. <i>The family was numerous.</i>
uncounted	Not counted. <i>The numbers could have included previously uncounted children.</i>
unnumberable	Too numerous to be counted.
unnumbered	Too numerous to be counted. <i>The exhibited items are unnumbered.</i>
unnumerable	Too numerous to be counted.
untold	Of an incalculable amount. <i>Untold suffering.</i>
very many	Being the exact same one; not any other.

Usage Examples of "Innumerable" as an adjective

Associations of "Innumerable" (30 Words)

abundance	(physics) the ratio of the number of atoms of a specific isotope of an element to the total number of isotopes present. <i>Vines and figs grew in abundance.</i>
<u>assorted</u>	Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds. <i>Bowls in assorted colours.</i>
<u>bounty</u>	Payment or reward (especially from a government) for acts such as catching criminals or killing predatory animals or enlisting in the military. <i>They do not qualify for their bounty because they have spent insufficient time at summer camp.</i>

<u>countless</u>	Too numerous to be counted. Countless hours.
dozen	The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one. <i>She has dozens of admirers.</i>
<u>enormously</u>	Extremely. <i>He was enormously popular.</i>
galore	Existing in abundance. <i>Whiskey galore.</i>
<u>highly</u>	Favourably. <i>His colleagues think very highly of him.</i>
<u>immeasurable</u>	Too large, extensive, or extreme to measure. Immeasurable wealth.
immensely	To a great extent; extremely. <i>Was immensely more important to the project as a scientist than as an administrator.</i>
incalculable	Too great to be calculated or estimated. Incalculable riches.
inestimable	Too great to calculate. <i>Jewels of inestimable value.</i>
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. Infinite wealth.
<u>infinity</u>	An infinite or very great number or amount. <i>The infinity of space.</i>
manifold	Combine or increase by multiplication. Manifold reasons.
many	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by 'as' or 'too' or 'so' or 'that'; amounting to a large but indefinite number. <i>A good many.</i>
measureless	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
much	(quantifier used with mass nouns) great in quantity or degree or extent. <i>Did it hurt much.</i>
multiplicity	A large number or variety. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>
<u>myriad</u>	The cardinal number that is the product of ten and one thousand. <i>He faced a myriad of details.</i>

numberless	Too many to be counted; innumerable. <i>There are numberless questions to be asked.</i>
numerous	Consisting of many members. <i>She had complained to the council on numerous occasions.</i>
outnumber	Be more numerous than. <i>Women outnumbered men by three to one.</i>
plentiful	Existing in or yielding great quantities; abundant. <i>A plentiful year.</i>
plethora	An excess of a bodily fluid, particularly blood. <i>A plethora of committees and subcommittees.</i>
plurality	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>Some languages add an extra syllable to mark plurality.</i>
surfeit	Supply or feed to surfeit. <i>A surfeit of food and drink.</i>
twelve	The cardinal number that is the sum of eleven and one.
untold	(of a story or event) not narrated or recounted. <i>Thieves caused untold damage.</i>
variously	In diverse ways. <i>His early successes can be variously accounted for.</i>
