- *In a state of mind which prevents normal perception, behaviour, or social interaction; seriously mentally ill.*
- *Extremely foolish; irrational.*

<b>asinine</b>	Devoid of intelligence. <i>Lydia ignored his <b>asinine</b> remark.</i>
<b>bizarre</b>	Very strange or unusual. <i>A <b>bizarre</b> situation.</i>
<b>certifiable</b>	Fit to be certified as insane (and treated accordingly). <i>A <b>certifiable</b> fact.</i>
<b>crazy</b>	Intensely enthusiastic about or preoccupied with. <i>Stella went <b>crazy</b> and assaulted a visitor.</i>
<b>farcical</b>	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. <i>A <b>farcical</b> situation.</i>
<b>fatuous</b>	Extremely silly or stupid. <i>A <b>fatuous</b> comment.</i>
<b>half-baked</b>	Foolish; totally unsound.
<b>harebrained</b>	Very foolish. <i><b>Harebrained</b> ideas.</i>
<b>idiotic</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>An <b>idiotic</b> idea.</i>
<b>ill-conceived</b>	Poorly conceived or thought out.
<b>imbecilic</b>	Having a mental age of three to seven years.

<b>inane</b>	Devoid of intelligence. <i>Don't badger people with <b>inane</b> questions.</i>
<b><u>laughable</u></b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>If it didn't make me so angry it would be <b>laughable</b>.</i>
<b><u>ludicrous</u></b>	Broadly or extravagantly humorous; resembling farce. <i>Every night he wore a <b>ludicrous</b> outfit.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>A man who had gone <b>mad</b>.</i>
<b><u>mindless</u></b>	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw. <i><b>Mindless</b> tasks.</i>
<b>moronic</b>	Having a mental age of between eight and twelve years. <i>Television's latest <b>moronic</b> soap opera.</i>
<b>nonsensical</b>	Having no intelligible meaning. <i>He dismissed the claim as <b>nonsensical</b>.</i>
<b>of unsound mind</b>	Physically unsound or diseased.
<b><u>pointless</u></b>	Having no points scores. <i>It's <b>pointless</b> to plan too far ahead.</i>
<b>preposterous</b>	Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous. <i>A <b>preposterous</b> suggestion.</i>
<b>psychotic</b>	Relating to, denoting, or suffering from a psychosis. <i>A <b>psychotic</b> disturbance.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	Deserving or inviting derision or mockery; absurd. <i>That <b>ridiculous</b> tartan cap.</i>
<b>schizophrenic</b>	Having, relating to, or characteristic of schizophrenia. <i><b>Schizophrenic</b> symptoms.</i>
<b>senseless</b>	Not marked by the use of reason. <i>The attack left a policeman beaten <b>senseless</b>.</i>
<b>silly</b>	Ludicrous, foolish. <i>He would brood about <b>silly</b> things.</i>
<b><u>weird</u></b>	Strikingly odd or unusual- Bram Stoker. <i>A <b>weird</b> coincidence.</i>

Capable of being guaranteed or certified.  
*It is possible that he will have to return to hospital but at the moment he is not **certifiable**.*

### **crazy**

Extremely.  
***Crazy** about cars and racing.*

### **daft**

Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.  
*Don't ask such **daft** questions.*

### **demented**

Behaving irrationally due to anger, distress, or excitement.  
*She was **demented** with worry.*

<b><u>deranged</u></b>	Driven insane. <i>A <b>deranged</b> gunman.</i>
<b>disturbed</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i><b>Disturbed</b> sleep.</i>
<b>epilepsy</b>	A disorder of the central nervous system characterized by loss of consciousness and convulsions.
<b>folly</b>	A theatrical revue with glamorous female performers. <i>An act of sheer <b>folly</b>.</i>
<b>frenetic</b>	Excessively agitated; distraught with fear or other violent emotion. <i><b>Frenetic</b> screams followed the accident.</i>
<b><u>frenzy</u></b>	A state or period of uncontrolled excitement or wild behaviour. <i>Doreen worked herself into a <b>frenzy</b> of rage.</i>
<b><u>hysteria</u></b>	Excessive or uncontrollable fear. <i>The anti Semitic <b>hysteria</b> of the 1890s.</i>
<b><u>hysterical</u></b>	Marked by excessive or uncontrollable emotion. <i>A mob of <b>hysterical</b> vigilantes.</i>
<b><u>insanity</u></b>	Extreme foolishness or irrationality. <i>It might be pure <b>insanity</b> to take this loan.</i>
<b><u>lunatic</u></b>	An extremely foolish or eccentric person. <i>This <b>lunatic</b> just accelerated out from the side of the road.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>She pictured loved ones <b>mad</b> with anxiety about her.</i>
<b>madden</b>	Cause to go crazy; cause to lose one's mind. <i>This is ridiculous she told him <b>maddened</b> by his reaction.</i>
<b>mania</b>	An excessive enthusiasm or desire; an obsession. <i>He had a <b>mania</b> for automobiles.</i>
<b>mentally</b>	In your mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and <b>mentally</b> exhausted.</i>
<b><u>neurotic</u></b>	A neurotic person. <i>I wasn't going to be labelled as a hypochondriac or <b>neurotic</b>.</i>
<b>nuts</b>	Mad. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me <b>nuts</b>.</i>

<b><u>paranoia</u></b>	<p>A mental condition characterized by delusions of persecution, unwarranted jealousy, or exaggerated self-importance, typically worked into an organized system. It may be an aspect of chronic personality disorder, of drug abuse, or of a serious condition such as schizophrenia in which the person loses touch with reality.</p> <p><i>Mild <b>paranoia</b> afflicts all prime ministers.</i></p>
<b><u>paranoid</u></b>	<p>A person who is paranoid.</p> <p><i>You think I m <b>paranoid</b> but I tell you there is something going on.</i></p>
<b><u>psychopath</u></b>	<p>Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.</p> <p><i>Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i></p>
<b>psychosis</b>	<p>A severe mental disorder in which thought and emotions are so impaired that contact is lost with external reality.</p> <p><i>They were suffering from a <b>psychosis</b>.</i></p>
<b><u>rabid</u></b>	<p>Of or connected with rabies.</p> <p><i><b>Rabid</b> isolationist.</i></p>
<b>raving</b>	<p>In a raving manner.</p> <p><i>The <b>raving</b> of maniacs.</i></p>
<b>schizophrenia</b>	<p>(in general use) a mentality or approach characterized by inconsistent or contradictory elements.</p> <p><i>Gibraltar s <b>schizophrenia</b> continues to be fed by colonial pride.</i></p>
<b><u>simpleton</u></b>	<p>A person lacking intelligence or common sense.</p> <p><i>Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b>.</i></p>
<b>unbalanced</b>	<p>Not giving accurate, fair, or equal coverage to all aspects; partial.</p> <p><i>This may give an <b>unbalanced</b> impression of the competition.</i></p>
