moronic Having a mental age of between eight and twelve years.

Television s latest **moronic** soap opera.

nonsensical Having no intelligible meaning.

He dismissed the claim as **nonsensical**.

of unsound mind Physically unsound or diseased.

Having no points scores.

It s **pointless** to plan too far ahead.

**preposterous**Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous.

A preposterous suggestion.

**psychotic**Relating to, denoting, or suffering from a psychosis.

A **psychotic** disturbance.

ridiculous Deserving or inviting derision or mockery; absurd.

That **ridiculous** tartan cap.

**schizophrenic** Having, relating to, or characteristic of schizophrenia.

**Schizophrenic** symptoms.

senseless Not marked by the use of reason.
