# Associations of "Insanely" (30 Words)

<u>bipolar</u>	Of a person suffering from bipolar disorder. <i>Bipolar species.</i>
certifiable	Capable of being guaranteed or certified. A <i>certifiable fact</i> .
crazy	Extremely. I ve been <b>crazy</b> busy.
<u>daft</u>	Infatuated with. Don t ask such <b>daft</b> questions.
demented	Affected with madness or insanity. She was <b>demented</b> with worry.
<u>deranged</u>	Driven insane. A <b>deranged</b> gunman.



disturbed	Affected with madness or insanity. The <b>disturbed</b> books and papers on her desk.
epilepsy	A disorder of the central nervous system characterized by loss of consciousness and convulsions.
folly	Lack of good sense; foolishness. An act of sheer <b>folly</b> .
frenetic	Fast and energetic in a rather wild and uncontrolled way. <i>Frenetic</i> screams followed the accident.
<u>frenzy</u>	A state or period of uncontrolled excitement or wild behaviour. Doreen worked herself into a <b>frenzy</b> of rage.
<u>hysteria</u>	Excessive or uncontrollable fear. The anti Semitic <b>hysteria</b> of the 1890s.
<u>hysterical</u>	Characterized by or arising from psychoneurotic hysteria- Morris Fishbein. A mob of <b>hysterical</b> vigilantes.
<u>insanity</u>	Extreme foolishness or irrationality. <i>He suffered from bouts of <b>insanity</b>.</i>
<u>lunatic</u>	Extremely foolish or eccentric. A ward of <b>lunatic</b> old ladies.
mad	Make someone mad. She pictured loved ones <b>mad</b> with anxiety about her.
madden	Drive (someone or something) insane. This is ridiculous she told him <b>madden</b> ed by his reaction.
mania	Mental illness marked by periods of great excitement or euphoria, delusions, and overactivity. <i>He had a <b>mania</b> for automobiles.</i>
mentally	In your mind. Soldiers become physically and <b>mentally</b> exhausted.
<u>neurotic</u>	A neurotic person. I wasn t going to be labelled as a hypochondriac or <b>neurotic</b> .
nuts	Mad. The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me <b>nuts</b> .
<u>paranoia</u>	Unjustified suspicion and mistrust of other people. Mild <b>paranoia</b> afflicts all prime ministers.
<u>paranoid</u>	A person who is paranoid. Further accusations would sound like the ramblings of a <b>paranoid</b> .



<u>psychopath</u>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.
psychosis	A severe mental disorder in which thought and emotions are so impaired that contact is lost with external reality. They were suffering from a <b>psychosis</b> .
<u>rabid</u>	Of or connected with rabies. The show s small but <b>rabid</b> fan base.
raving	In a raving manner. The <b>raving</b> s of a madwoman.
schizophrenia	A long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behaviour, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation. <i>Gibraltar s schizophrenia</i> continues to be fed by colonial pride.
<u>simpleton</u>	A foolish or gullible person. Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b> .
unbalanced	Debits and credits are not equal. This may give an <b>unbalanced</b> impression of the competition.
