- *In a foolish, wild, or uncontrolled manner.*
- *In an insane manner.*
- *To an extreme degree.*



## Synonyms of "Insanely" as an adverb (6 Words)

- crazily** In a mad, wild, or erratic way.  
*An audience of boys laughed **crazily**.*
- deadly** In a way resembling or suggesting death; as if dead.  
*Her skin was **deadly** pale.*
- dementedly** In an insane manner.  
*Screaming **dementedly**.*
- deucedly** Extremely (used as intensives).  
*They re **deucedly** hard to find.*
- devilishly** As a devil; in an evil manner.  
*The socialists are further handicapped if they believe that capitalists are not only wicked but also **devilishly** clever.*

**madly**

In an uncontrolled manner.

*She fought back **madly**.*



### Usage Examples of "Insanely" as an adverb

- *William stood grinning insanely.*
- *He drives insanely.*
- *Insanely jealous.*
- *She behaved insanely.*
- *I couldn't help feeling insanely jealous.*
- *I have to be up insanely early.*

Capable of being guaranteed or certified.

A ***certifiable*** fact.

### crazy

Extremely.

*I've been **crazy** busy.*

### daft

Infatuated with.

*Don't ask such **daft** questions.*

### demented

Affected with madness or insanity.

*She was **demented** with worry.*

### deranged

Driven insane.

A ***deranged*** gunman.

<b>disturbed</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>The <b>disturbed</b> books and papers on her desk.</i>
<b>epilepsy</b>	A disorder of the central nervous system characterized by loss of consciousness and convulsions.
<b>folly</b>	Lack of good sense; foolishness. <i>An act of sheer <b>folly</b>.</i>
<b>frenetic</b>	Fast and energetic in a rather wild and uncontrolled way. <i><b>Frenetic</b> screams followed the accident.</i>
<u>frenzy</u>	A state or period of uncontrolled excitement or wild behaviour. <i>Doreen worked herself into a <b>frenzy</b> of rage.</i>
<u>hysteria</u>	Excessive or uncontrollable fear. <i>The anti Semitic <b>hysteria</b> of the 1890s.</i>
<u>hysterical</u>	Characterized by or arising from psychoneurotic hysteria- Morris Fishbein. <i>A mob of <b>hysterical</b> vigilantes.</i>
<u>insanity</u>	Extreme foolishness or irrationality. <i>He suffered from bouts of <b>insanity</b>.</i>
<u>lunatic</u>	Extremely foolish or eccentric. <i>A ward of <b>lunatic</b> old ladies.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Make someone mad. <i>She pictured loved ones <b>mad</b> with anxiety about her.</i>
<b>madden</b>	Drive (someone or something) insane. <i>This is ridiculous she told him <b>maddened</b> by his reaction.</i>
<b>mania</b>	Mental illness marked by periods of great excitement or euphoria, delusions, and overactivity. <i>He had a <b>mania</b> for automobiles.</i>
<b>mentally</b>	In your mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and <b>mentally</b> exhausted.</i>
<u>neurotic</u>	A neurotic person. <i>I wasn't going to be labelled as a hypochondriac or <b>neurotic</b>.</i>
<b>nuts</b>	Mad. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me <b>nuts</b>.</i>
<u>paranoia</u>	Unjustified suspicion and mistrust of other people. <i>Mild <b>paranoia</b> afflicts all prime ministers.</i>
<u>paranoid</u>	A person who is paranoid. <i>Further accusations would sound like the ramblings of a <b>paranoid</b>.</i>

<b><u>psychopath</u></b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
<b>psychosis</b>	A severe mental disorder in which thought and emotions are so impaired that contact is lost with external reality. <i>They were suffering from a <b>psychosis</b>.</i>
<b><u>rabid</u></b>	Of or connected with rabies. <i>The show s small but <b>rabid</b> fan base.</i>
<b>raving</b>	In a raving manner. <i>The <b>ravings</b> of a madwoman.</i>
<b>schizophrenia</b>	A long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behaviour, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation. <i>Gibraltar s <b>schizophrenia</b> continues to be fed by colonial pride.</i>
<b><u>simpleton</u></b>	A foolish or gullible person. <i>Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b>.</i>
<b>unbalanced</b>	Debits and credits are not equal. <i>This may give an <b>unbalanced</b> impression of the competition.</i>
