Definitions of "Insanely" as an adverb

- *(used as intensives) extremely.*
- *In a foolish, wild, or uncontrolled manner.*
- *In an insane manner.*
- *To an extreme degree.*



Synonyms of "Insanely" as an adverb (6 Words)

- crazily** In a mad, wild, or erratic way.
*An audience of boys laughed **crazily**.*
- deadly** In a way resembling or suggesting death; as if dead.
*Her skin was **deadly** pale.*
- dementedly** In an insane manner.
*Screaming **dementedly**.*
- deucedly** Extremely (used as intensives).
*They re **deucedly** hard to find.*
- devilishly** As a devil; in an evil manner.
*The socialists are further handicapped if they believe that capitalists are not only wicked but also **devilishly** clever.*

madly

In an uncontrolled manner.

*She fought back **madly**.*



Usage Examples of "Insanely" as an adverb

- *William stood grinning insanely.*
- *He drives insanely.*
- *Insanely jealous.*
- *She behaved insanely.*
- *I couldn't help feeling insanely jealous.*
- *I have to be up insanely early.*

bipolar	Of a person suffering from bipolar disorder. <i>Bipolar species.</i>
certifiable	Capable of being guaranteed or certified. <i>A certifiable fact.</i>
crazy	Extremely. <i>I ve been crazy busy.</i>
daft	Infatuated with. <i>Don t ask such daft questions.</i>
demented	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>She was demented with worry.</i>
deranged	Driven insane. <i>A deranged gunman.</i>

disturbed	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>The disturbed books and papers on her desk.</i>
epilepsy	A disorder of the central nervous system characterized by loss of consciousness and convulsions.
folly	Lack of good sense; foolishness. <i>An act of sheer folly.</i>
frenetic	Fast and energetic in a rather wild and uncontrolled way. <i>Frenetic screams followed the accident.</i>
frenzy	A state or period of uncontrolled excitement or wild behaviour. <i>Doreen worked herself into a frenzy of rage.</i>
hysteria	Excessive or uncontrollable fear. <i>The anti Semitic hysteria of the 1890s.</i>
hysterical	Characterized by or arising from psychoneurotic hysteria- Morris Fishbein. <i>A mob of hysterical vigilantes.</i>
insanity	Extreme foolishness or irrationality. <i>He suffered from bouts of insanity.</i>
lunatic	Extremely foolish or eccentric. <i>A ward of lunatic old ladies.</i>
mad	Make someone mad. <i>She pictured loved ones mad with anxiety about her.</i>
madden	Drive (someone or something) insane. <i>This is ridiculous she told him maddened by his reaction.</i>
mania	Mental illness marked by periods of great excitement or euphoria, delusions, and overactivity. <i>He had a mania for automobiles.</i>
mentally	In your mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and mentally exhausted.</i>
neurotic	A neurotic person. <i>I wasn't going to be labelled as a hypochondriac or neurotic.</i>
nuts	Mad. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me nuts.</i>
paranoia	Unjustified suspicion and mistrust of other people. <i>Mild paranoia afflicts all prime ministers.</i>
paranoid	A person who is paranoid. <i>Further accusations would sound like the ramblings of a paranoid.</i>

- psychopath** Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.
*Playground **psychopaths** will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.*
- psychosis** A severe mental disorder in which thought and emotions are so impaired that contact is lost with external reality.
*They were suffering from a **psychosis**.*
- rabid** Of or connected with rabies.
*The show s small but **rabid** fan base.*
- raving** In a raving manner.
*The **ravings** of a madwoman.*
- schizophrenia** A long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behaviour, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation.
*Gibraltar s **schizophrenia** continues to be fed by colonial pride.*
- simpleton** A foolish or gullible person.
*Stop grinning at me like a **simpleton**.*
- unbalanced** Debits and credits are not equal.
*This may give an **unbalanced** impression of the competition.*
