amok	Frenzied as if possessed by a demon.
berserk	One of the ancient Norse warriors legendary for working themselves into a frenzy before a battle and fighting with reckless savagery and insane fury. <i>Berserk with grief.</i>
certifiable	Able or needing to be officially recorded. <i>It is possible that he will have to return to hospital but at the moment he is not certifiable.</i>
crazy	Foolish. <i>I ve been crazy busy.</i>
daft	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i>Don t ask such daft questions.</i>
demented	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>She was demented with worry.</i>
demoniac	Someone who acts as if possessed by a demon. <i>A goddess with both divine and demoniac qualities.</i>
deranged	Mad; insane. <i>A deranged gunman.</i>
disturbed	Having the place or position changed. <i>Lapsed into disturbed sleep.</i>
dumb	Make dumb or unheard silence. <i>A dumb question.</i>
folly	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>Trying to drive through a blizzard is the height of folly.</i>
foolery	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>We endured his foolery all afternoon.</i>
harebrained	Very foolish. <i>Harebrained ideas.</i>

hubris	Overbearing pride or presumption. <i>The self assured hubris among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.</i>
idiot	A person of low intelligence.
imbecility	Retardation more severe than a moron but not as severe as an idiot.
indulgence	In the Roman Catholic Church a grant by the Pope of remission of the temporal punishment in purgatory still due for sins after absolution The unrestricted sale of indulgences by pardoners was a widespread abuse during the later Middle Ages. <i>In the Middle Ages the unrestricted sale of indulgences by pardoners became a widespread abuse.</i>
lunacy	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>It has been suggested that originality demands a degree of lunacy.</i>
lunatic	A reckless impetuous irresponsible person. <i>He would be asked to acquiesce in some lunatic scheme.</i>
mad	Make someone mad. <i>He s mad about football.</i>
maniac	A person suffering from mania. <i>A maniacal frenzy.</i>
mentally	In a manner relating to the mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and mentally exhausted.</i>
nuts	Mad. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me nuts.</i>
psychopath	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground psychopaths will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
raving	In a raving manner. <i>Raving mad.</i>
silly	Ludicrous, foolish. <i>Silly giggles.</i>
simpleton	A person lacking intelligence or common sense. <i>Stop grinning at me like a simpleton.</i>
stupidity	A poor ability to understand or to profit from experience. <i>A comedy of infantile stupidity.</i>
unbalanced	Being or thrown out of equilibrium. <i>She considered him to be mentally unbalanced and dangerous.</i>
