<b><a href="#">amok</a></b>	Frenzied as if possessed by a demon.
<b>berserk</b>	One of the ancient Norse warriors legendary for working themselves into a frenzy before a battle and fighting with reckless savagery and insane fury. <i><b>Berserk</b> with grief.</i>
<b>certifiable</b>	Able or needing to be officially recorded. <i>It is possible that he will have to return to hospital but at the moment he is not <b>certifiable</b>.</i>
<b>crazy</b>	Foolish. <i>I ve been <b>crazy</b> busy.</i>
<b><a href="#">daft</a></b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i>Don t ask such <b>daft</b> questions.</i>
<b>demented</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>She was <b>demented</b> with worry.</i>
<b>demoniac</b>	Someone who acts as if possessed by a demon. <i>A goddess with both divine and <b>demoniac</b> qualities.</i>
<b><a href="#">deranged</a></b>	Mad; insane. <i>A <b>deranged</b> gunman.</i>
<b>disturbed</b>	Having the place or position changed. <i>Lapsed into <b>disturbed</b> sleep.</i>
<b>dumb</b>	Make dumb or unheard silence. <i>A <b>dumb</b> question.</i>
<b>folly</b>	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>Trying to drive through a blizzard is the height of <b>folly</b>.</i>
<b>foolery</b>	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>We endured his <b>foolery</b> all afternoon.</i>
<b>harebrained</b>	Very foolish. <i><b>Harebrained</b> ideas.</i>

<b>hubris</b>	Overbearing pride or presumption. <i>The self assured <b>hubris</b> among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.</i>
<b>idiot</b>	A person of low intelligence.
<b>imbecility</b>	Retardation more severe than a moron but not as severe as an idiot.
<b>indulgence</b>	In the Roman Catholic Church a grant by the Pope of remission of the temporal punishment in purgatory still due for sins after absolution The unrestricted sale of indulgences by pardoners was a widespread abuse during the later Middle Ages. <i>In the Middle Ages the unrestricted sale of <b>indulgences</b> by pardoners became a widespread abuse.</i>
<b>lunacy</b>	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>It has been suggested that originality demands a degree of <b>lunacy</b>.</i>
<b>lunatic</b>	A reckless impetuous irresponsible person. <i>He would be asked to acquiesce in some <b>lunatic</b> scheme.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Make someone mad. <i>He s <b>mad</b> about football.</i>
<b>maniac</b>	A person suffering from mania. <i>A <b>maniacal</b> frenzy.</i>
<b>mentally</b>	In a manner relating to the mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and <b>mentally</b> exhausted.</i>
<b>nuts</b>	Mad. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me <b>nuts</b>.</i>
<b>psychopath</b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
<b>raving</b>	In a raving manner. <i><b>Raving</b> mad.</i>
<b>silly</b>	Ludicrous, foolish. <i><b>Silly</b> giggles.</i>
<b>simpleton</b>	A person lacking intelligence or common sense. <i>Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b>.</i>
<b>stupidity</b>	A poor ability to understand or to profit from experience. <i>A comedy of infantile <b>stupidity</b>.</i>
<b>unbalanced</b>	Being or thrown out of equilibrium. <i>She considered him to be mentally <b>unbalanced</b> and dangerous.</i>
