### avid

Having an eager desire for.  
*The esurient eyes of an **avid** curiosity.*

### compulsive

(of a person) acting as a result of an irresistible urge.  
***Compulsive** eating.*

### eager

Strongly wanting to do or have something.  
*Young intellectuals **eager** for knowledge.*

### gluttonous

Excessively greedy.  
*A **gluttonous** debauch.*

### greedy

Wanting to eat or drink more than one can reasonably consume.  
*People driven from their land by **greedy** developers.*

### hungry

Extremely desirous.  
***Hungry** for recognition.*

### insatiate

Never satisfied.  
*An **insatiate** appetite.*

<b>keen</b>	(of a smell, light, or sound) penetrating; clear. <i>John was <b>keen</b> to help.</i>
<b>omnivorous</b>	Indiscriminate in taking in or using whatever is available. <i>An <b>omnivorous</b> reader.</i>
<b>prodigious</b>	Of momentous or ominous significance- Herman Melville. <i>The young Mozart s <b>prodigious</b> talents.</i>
<b>rapacious</b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i>The <b>rapacious</b> wolf.</i>
<b>ravening</b>	Living by preying on other animals especially by catching living prey. <i>They turned on each other like <b>ravening</b> wolves.</i>
<b>ravenous</b>	Extremely hungry. <i>A <b>ravenous</b> appetite.</i>
<b>unappeasable</b>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>Divine <b>unappeasable</b> justice.</i>
<b>uncontrollable</b>	Impossible to repress or control. <i><b>Uncontrollable</b> children.</i>
<b>uncontrolled</b>	Not controlled. <i><b>Uncontrolled</b> growth.</i>
<b>unquenchable</b>	Impossible to quench. <i>His enthusiasm was <b>unquenchable</b>.</i>
<b>unsatiable</b>	Impossible to satisfy. <i>His passion for work was <b>unsatiable</b>.</i>
<b>voracious</b>	Wanting or devouring great quantities of food. <i>Paying taxes to <b>voracious</b> governments.</i>
<b>wolfish</b>	Resembling or likened to a wolf, especially in being rapacious, voracious, or lascivious. <i><b>Wolfish</b> rapacity.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Insatiable" as an adjective

- *So insatiable a gourmand as myself.*
- *'You're insatiable!' she cried as she pushed him away.*
- *An insatiable hunger for success.*

<b>addle</b>	Make (someone) unable to think clearly; confuse. <i><b>Addled</b> eggs.</i>
<b>appetite</b>	A natural desire to satisfy a bodily need, especially for food. <i>He has a healthy <b>appetite</b>.</i>
<b>champ</b>	Chafe at the bit, like horses. <i>He was already on the plane <b>champing</b> to get off to Lagos.</i>
<b>chomp</b>	Munch or chew noisily or vigorously. <i>She <b>chomped</b> on a roll.</i>
<b><u>craving</u></b>	An intense desire for some particular thing. <i>A <b>craving</b> for chocolate.</i>
<b>desire</b>	Something desired. <i>John spake unto him and <b>desired</b> him in like manner and contestation as before.</i>
<b>eat</b>	Eat a meal take a meal. <i>What s <b>eating</b> you.</i>
<b>epicurean</b>	Of Epicurus or epicureanism. <i><b>Epicurean</b> pleasures.</i>
<b>glutton</b>	A person who is excessively fond of something. <i>He s a <b>glutton</b> for adventure.</i>
<b>gluttonous</b>	Excessively greedy. <i>A <b>gluttonous</b> appetite for food and praise and pleasure.</i>
<b>gourmand</b>	A person who is devoted to eating and drinking to excess.
<b>greedy</b>	Having or showing an intense and selfish desire for wealth or power. <i>People driven from their land by <b>greedy</b> developers.</i>
<b>hedonistic</b>	Devoted to pleasure. <i>A <b>hedonistic</b> existence of booze drugs and parties.</i>
<b><u>hunger</u></b>	Feel or suffer hunger. <i>They died from cold and <b>hunger</b>.</i>
<b>hungry</b>	Feeling hunger; feeling a need or desire to eat food. <i>I always find art galleries <b>hungry</b> work.</i>
<b>lupine</b>	Any plant of the genus <i>Lupinus</i> ; bearing erect spikes of usually purplish-blue flowers.
<b>porcine</b>	Repellently fat. <i>A bald <b>porcine</b> old man.</i>



<b>rapacious</b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i>The <b>rapacious</b> wolf.</i>
<b>raptorial</b>	(of a bird or other animal) predatory. <i><b>Raptorial</b> birds.</i>
<b>ravening</b>	Living by preying on other animals especially by catching living prey. <i><b>Ravening</b> wolves.</i>
<u><b>ravenous</b></u>	Extremely hungry. <i>I d been out all day and was <b>ravenous</b>.</i>
<b>slake</b>	Make less active or intense. <i><b>Slake</b> your thirst with citron press.</i>
<u><b>starve</b></u>	Die of food deprivation. <i>She left her animals to <b>starve</b>.</i>
<b>tantalize</b>	Harass with persistent criticism or carping. <i>Such ambitious questions have long <b>tantalized</b> the world s best thinkers.</i>
<b>thirst</b>	Lack of the liquid needed to sustain life. <i>A <b>thirst</b> for knowledge.</i>
<u><b>unquenchable</b></u>	Not able to be quenched. <i><b>Unquenchable</b> thirst.</i>
<u><b>unsatisfactory</b></u>	Not giving satisfaction. <i>Her performance proved to be <b>unsatisfactory</b>.</i>
<u><b>unsatisfied</b></u>	Not having been satisfied. <i>The compromise left all sides <b>unsatisfied</b>.</i>
<u><b>voracious</b></u>	Engaging in an activity with great eagerness or enthusiasm. <i>Paying taxes to <b>voracious</b> governments.</i>
<b>yearning</b>	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>A <b>yearning</b> hope.</i>
