<b>animating</b>	Giving spirit and vivacity.
<b>blissful</b>	Providing perfect happiness or great joy. <i>The <b>blissful</b> caress of cool cotton sheets.</i>
<b>bracing</b>	A structural member used to stiffen a framework. <i><b>Bracing</b> struts.</i>
<b>catalyst</b>	A substance that increases the rate of a chemical reaction without itself undergoing any permanent chemical change. <i>Chlorine acts as a <b>catalyst</b> promoting the breakdown of ozone.</i>
<b>challenging</b>	Disturbingly provocative. <i>There was a <b>challenging</b> glint in his eyes.</i>
<b>cheer</b>	Cause somebody to feel happier or more cheerful. <i>She <b>cheered</b> from the sidelines.</i>
<b>encourage</b>	Inspire with confidence; give hope or courage to. <i>Pupils are <b>encouraged</b> to be creative.</i>
<b>enliven</b>	Make (someone) more cheerful or animated. <i>The wartime routine was <b>enlivened</b> by a series of concerts.</i>
<b>entertaining</b>	Agreeably diverting. <i>A charming and <b>entertaining</b> companion.</i>
<b>exciting</b>	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>One of the most <b>exciting</b> matches I've ever seen.</i>
<b>exhilarating</b>	Making lively and cheerful. <i>The <b>exhilarating</b> effect of mountain air.</i>
<b>incentive</b>	A thing that motivates or encourages someone to do something. <i>Give farmers an <b>incentive</b> to improve their land.</i>
<b>inspire</b>	Create (a feeling, especially a positive one) in a person. <i>Their past record does not <b>inspire</b> confidence.</i>

<b><u>invigorating</u></b>	Imparting strength and vitality. <i>A brisk <b>invigorating</b> walk.</i>
<b>motivation</b>	The condition of being motivated. <i>The following proposal and <b>motivation</b> is submitted for consideration.</i>
<b><u>motivational</u></b>	Relating to the reason or reasons for acting or behaving in a particular way. <i>Concern for the poor remains a strong <b>motivational</b> factor in my thinking.</i>
<b><u>motive</u></b>	A motif in art, literature, or music. <i>Police were unable to establish a <b>motive</b> for his murder.</i>
<b>pep</b>	Liveliness and energy. <i>Measures to <b>pep</b> up the economy.</i>
<b>piquant</b>	Attracting or delighting. <i>A <b>piquant</b> wit.</i>
<b>provocation</b>	Action or speech held to be likely to prompt physical retaliation. <i>Twenty patients had a high increase of serum gastrin after <b>provocation</b> with secretin.</i>
<b><u>raunchy</u></b>	Suggestive of or tending to moral looseness. <i>A <b>raunchy</b> novel.</i>
<b><u>refreshing</u></b>	Imparting vitality and energy. <i>Common sense of a most <b>refreshing</b> sort.</i>
<b>rousing</b>	Rousing to activity or heightened action as by spurring or goading. <i>A <b>rousing</b> sermon.</i>
<b><u>sensational</u></b>	Relating to or concerned in sensation. <i>You look <b>sensational</b>.</i>
<b>stimulate</b>	Stir the feelings, emotions, or peace of. <i>This herbal infusion doesn't <b>stimulate</b>.</i>
<b>stimulating</b>	That stimulates. <i>A <b>stimulating</b> discussion.</i>
<b><u>stimulus</u></b>	A thing or event that evokes a specific functional reaction in an organ or tissue. <i>If the tax were abolished it would act as a <b>stimulus</b> to exports.</i>
<b><u>stirring</u></b>	Arousing to a particular emotion or action. <i>A <b>stirring</b> and thriving politician.</i>
<b><u>thrilling</u></b>	Causing excitement and pleasure; exhilarating. <i>A <b>thrilling</b> performer to watch.</i>
<b><u>titillate</u></b>	Excite pleurably or erotically. <i>The press are paid to <b>titillate</b> the public.</i>
