animating	Giving spirit and vivacity.
blissful	Providing perfect happiness or great joy. <i>The blissful caress of cool cotton sheets.</i>
bracing	A structural member used to stiffen a framework. <i>Bracing struts.</i>
catalyst	A substance that increases the rate of a chemical reaction without itself undergoing any permanent chemical change. <i>Chlorine acts as a catalyst promoting the breakdown of ozone.</i>
challenging	Disturbingly provocative. <i>There was a challenging glint in his eyes.</i>
cheer	Cause somebody to feel happier or more cheerful. <i>She cheered from the sidelines.</i>
encourage	Inspire with confidence; give hope or courage to. <i>Pupils are encouraged to be creative.</i>
enliven	Make (someone) more cheerful or animated. <i>The wartime routine was enlivened by a series of concerts.</i>
entertaining	Agreeably diverting. <i>A charming and entertaining companion.</i>
exciting	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>One of the most exciting matches I ve ever seen.</i>
exhilarating	Making lively and cheerful. <i>The exhilarating effect of mountain air.</i>
incentive	A thing that motivates or encourages someone to do something. <i>Give farmers an incentive to improve their land.</i>
inspire	Create (a feeling, especially a positive one) in a person. <i>Their past record does not inspire confidence.</i>

<u>invigorating</u>	Imparting strength and vitality. <i>A brisk invigorating walk.</i>
motivation	The condition of being motivated. <i>The following proposal and motivation is submitted for consideration.</i>
<u>motivational</u>	Relating to the reason or reasons for acting or behaving in a particular way. <i>Concern for the poor remains a strong motivational factor in my thinking.</i>
<u>motive</u>	A motif in art, literature, or music. <i>Police were unable to establish a motive for his murder.</i>
pep	Liveliness and energy. <i>Measures to pep up the economy.</i>
piquant	Attracting or delighting. <i>A piquant wit.</i>
provocation	Action or speech held to be likely to prompt physical retaliation. <i>Twenty patients had a high increase of serum gastrin after provocation with secretin.</i>
<u>raunchy</u>	Suggestive of or tending to moral looseness. <i>A raunchy novel.</i>
<u>refreshing</u>	Imparting vitality and energy. <i>Common sense of a most refreshing sort.</i>
rousing	Rousing to activity or heightened action as by spurring or goading. <i>A rousing sermon.</i>
<u>sensational</u>	Relating to or concerned in sensation. <i>You look sensational.</i>
stimulate	Stir the feelings, emotions, or peace of. <i>This herbal infusion doesn't stimulate.</i>
stimulating	That stimulates. <i>A stimulating discussion.</i>
<u>stimulus</u>	A thing or event that evokes a specific functional reaction in an organ or tissue. <i>If the tax were abolished it would act as a stimulus to exports.</i>
<u>stirring</u>	Arousing to a particular emotion or action. <i>A stirring and thriving politician.</i>
<u>thrilling</u>	Causing excitement and pleasure; exhilarating. <i>A thrilling performer to watch.</i>
<u>titillate</u>	Excite pleurably or erotically. <i>The press are paid to titillate the public.</i>
