appoint Create and charge with a task or function.
*She has been **appointed** to the board.*

ensconce Establish or settle (someone) in a comfortable, safe place.
*He **ensconced** himself in the chair.*

establish Establish the validity of something as by an example explanation or experiment.
***Establish** a new department.*

fit Make fit.
*The shoes **fitted** better after being stretched.*

fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>There are no facts which fix the defendant with liability.</i>
inaugurate	Open ceremoniously or dedicate formally. <i>He inaugurated a new policy of trade and exploration.</i>
induct	Accept people into an exclusive society or group, usually with some rite. <i>Hugh and his friends were inducted into the most honourable seats.</i>
instal	Place. <i>The new president was installed immediately after the election.</i>
instate	Set up in position; install or establish. <i>Many of the troops had only joined up when the new regime was instated.</i>
institute	Advance or set forth in court. <i>Institute proceedings.</i>
introduce	Put or introduce into something. <i>Bills can be introduced in either House of Parliament.</i>
invest	Make an investment. <i>I invested in an expensive moisturizer and tried to drink more water.</i>
locate	Discover the exact place or position of. <i>The company located some of their agents in Los Angeles.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The man who lodged in the room next door.</i>
place	Identify the location or place of. <i>She eventually said she couldn't place him.</i>
plant	Cover or supply an area of land with plants. <i>They claimed that the drugs had been planted on them by police.</i>
plump	Make fat or plump. <i>I plumped for the losing candidates.</i>
position	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>A development plan which will position the city as a major economic force in the region.</i>
put	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>They put my name on the cover page.</i>
put in	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
put in place	Make an investment.
seat	Of a vehicle or building have seats for a specified number of people. <i>The host seated me next to Mrs Smith.</i>
set in place	Apply or start.
set up	Urge to attack someone.

settle	End a legal dispute by arriving at a settlement. <i>Exactly what goes into the legislation has not been settled.</i>
site	Assign a location to. <i>The rectory is sited behind the church.</i>
situate	Put in context; describe the circumstances surrounding (something). <i>The pilot light is usually situated at the front of the boiler.</i>
station	Assign to a station. <i>Troops were stationed in the town.</i>
swear in	Utter obscenities or profanities.
take on	Occupy or take on.

	In a manner that is suitable or proper in the circumstances.
appropriately	<i>Walls of raw concrete form a neutral yet appropriately rugged backdrop for the various objects.</i>
aptly	In a manner that is appropriate or suitable in the circumstances. <i>America's aptly named Sunshine State.</i>
arrange	Arrange attractively. <i>Can you arrange a meeting with the President.</i>
arranged	Deliberately arranged for effect. <i>An arranged marriage.</i>
automate	Convert (a process or facility) to be operated by largely automatic equipment. <i>Automate the movement of the robot.</i>
configure	Set up for a particular purpose. <i>The memory can be configured as a virtual drive.</i>
create	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>He was created a baronet.</i>
database	An organized body of related information. <i>Database systems.</i>
electronically	In a way that relates to electrons. <i>Molecules that can accept energy to form electronically excited states.</i>
equipped	Provided or fitted out with what is necessary or useful or appropriate. <i>A well equipped playground.</i>
establish	Establish the validity of something as by an example explanation or experiment. <i>He had established himself as a film star.</i>
fixing	The action of fastening something in place. <i>Police investigating the alleged fixing of horse races.</i>
found	Use as a basis for found on. <i>Found art.</i>
furnish	Give something useful or necessary to. <i>She was able to furnish me with details of the incident.</i>
institute	An organization having a particular purpose, especially one that is involved with science, education, or a specific profession. <i>The award was instituted in 1900.</i>

ordered	Having a systematic arrangement; especially having elements succeeding in order according to rule. <i>An ordered sequence.</i>
organize	Plan and direct (a complex undertaking). <i>Social programmes are organized by the school.</i>
prepare	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>Prepare a brief summary of the article.</i>
prepared	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <i>A prepared statement.</i>
properly	In the right manner. <i>Please do your job properly.</i>
ready	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>Those who have ready access to the arts.</i>
rig	The particular way in which a sailing boat's masts, sails and rigging are arranged. <i>The power plant of the lifeboat had been rigged to explode.</i>
set	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. <i>Set up an experiment.</i>
setting	The context and environment in which something is set. <i>You can't do that in a university setting.</i>
setup	An act that incriminates someone on a false charge. <i>It takes time to learn the setup around here.</i>
software	(computer science) written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory. <i>The market for software is expected to expand.</i>
standby	Ready for emergency use. <i>Passengers were obliged to go on standby.</i>
suitably	In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances. <i>The judges were suitably impressed.</i>
troubleshoot	Analyse and solve serious problems for a company or other organization. <i>Follow the error messages to troubleshoot.</i>
