

admit to office Have room for; hold without crowding.


appoint	Create and charge with a task or function. She has been appoint ed to the board.
ensconce	Establish or settle (someone) in a comfortable, safe place. <i>He ensconced himself in the chair.</i>
establish	Establish the validity of something as by an example explanation or experiment. Establish a new department.
fit	Make fit. The shoes fit ted better after being stretched.



fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. There are no facts which fix the defendant with liability.
inaugurate	Open ceremoniously or dedicate formally. He inaugurate d a new policy of trade and exploration.
induct	Accept people into an exclusive society or group, usually with some rite. <i>Hugh and his friends were inducted into the most honourable seats.</i>
instal	Place. The new president was instal led immediately after the election.
instate	Set up in position; install or establish. Many of the troops had only joined up when the new regime was instate d.
institute	Advance or set forth in court. <i>Institute</i> proceedings.
introduce	Put or introduce into something. Bills can be introduce d in either House of Parliament.
<u>invest</u>	Make an investment. I invest ed in an expensive moisturizer and tried to drink more water.
locate	Discover the exact place or position of. The company locate d some of their agents in Los Angeles.
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. The man who lodge d in the room next door.
place	Identify the location or place of. She eventually said she couldn t place him.
plant	Cover or supply an area of land with plants. They claimed that the drugs had been plant ed on them by police.
<u>plump</u>	Make fat or plump. I plump ed for the losing candidates.
position	Put into a certain place or abstract location. A development plan which will position the city as a major economic force in the region.
put	Put into a certain place or abstract location. They put my name on the cover page.
put in	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
put in place	Make an investment.
seat	Of a vehicle or building have seats for a specified number of people. The host seat ed me next to Mrs Smith.
set in place	Apply or start.
set up	Urge to attack someone.



settle	End a legal dispute by arriving at a settlement. Exactly what goes into the legislation has not been settle d.
<u>site</u>	Assign a location to. The rectory is site d behind the church.
situate	Put in context; describe the circumstances surrounding (something. The pilot light is usually situate d at the front of the boiler.
station	Assign to a station. Troops were station ed in the town.
swear in	Utter obscenities or profanities.
take on	Occupy or take on.

configure	Set up for a particular purpose. The memory can be configure d as a virtual drive.
create	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>He was created a baronet.</i>
database	An organized body of related information. Database systems.
electronically	In a way that relates to electrons. Molecules that can accept energy to form electronically excited states.
<u>equipped</u>	Provided or fitted out with what is necessary or useful or appropriate. A well equipped playground.
establish	Establish the validity of something as by an example explanation or experiment. <i>He had established himself as a film star.</i>
fixing	The action of fastening something in place. Police investigating the alleged fixing of horse races.
found	Use as a basis for found on. Found art.
<u>furnish</u>	Give something useful or necessary to. She was able to furnish me with details of the incident.
institute	An organization having a particular purpose, especially one that is involved with science, education, or a specific profession. <i>The award was instituted in 1900.</i>



ordered	Having a systematic arrangement; especially having elements succeeding in order according to rule. An ordered sequence.
<u>organize</u>	Plan and direct (a complex undertaking. Social programmes are organize d by the school.
<u>prepare</u>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. Prepare a brief summary of the article.
prepared	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. A prepared statement.
properly	In the right manner. Please do your job properly .
ready	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. Those who have ready access to the arts.
rig	The particular way in which a sailing boat s masts sails and rigging are arranged. The power plant of the lifeboat had been rig ged to explode.
set	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. Set up an experiment.
setting	The context and environment in which something is set. You can t do that in a university setting .
setup	An act that incriminates someone on a false charge. It takes time to learn the setup around here.
software	(computer science) written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory. <i>The market for software is expected to expand.</i>
standby	Ready for emergency use. Passengers were obliged to go on standby .
suitably	In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances. <i>The judges were suitably impressed.</i>
troubleshoot	Analyse and solve serious problems for a company or other organization. <i>Follow the error messages to troubleshoot.</i>
