- *Put into an office or a position.*
- *Place.*
- *Place (someone) in a new position of authority, especially with ceremony.*

**admit to office** Have room for; hold without crowding.

**appoint** Create and charge with a task or function.  
*She has been **appointed** to the board.*

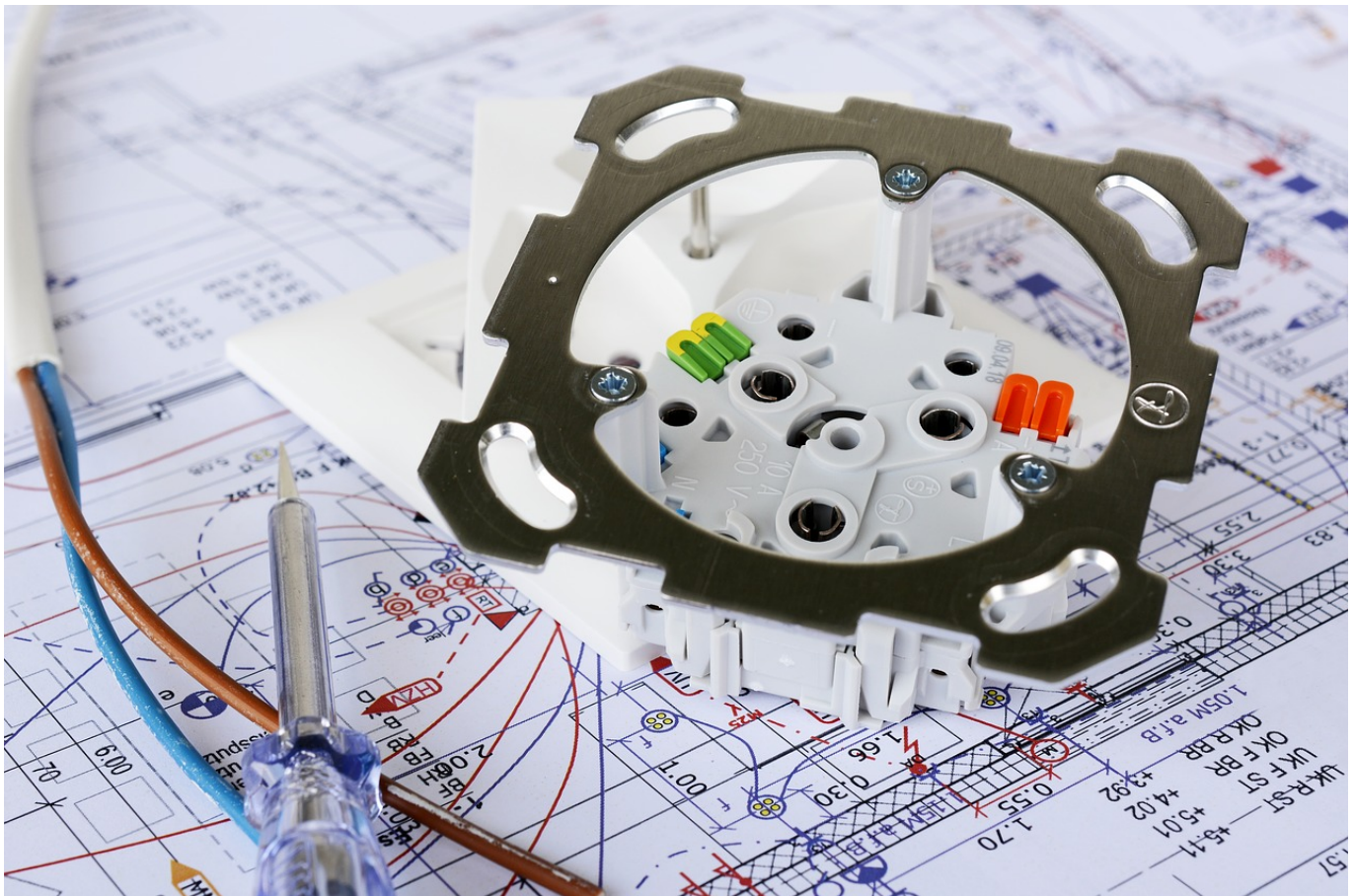
**ensconce** Establish or settle (someone) in a comfortable, safe place.  
*He **ensconced** himself in the chair.*

**establish** Establish the validity of something as by an example explanation or experiment.  
***Establish** a new department.*

**fit** Make fit.  
*The shoes **fitted** better after being stretched.*

<b>fix</b>	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>There are no facts which <b>fix</b> the defendant with liability.</i>
<b>inaugurate</b>	Open ceremoniously or dedicate formally. <i>He <b>inaugurated</b> a new policy of trade and exploration.</i>
<b>induct</b>	Accept people into an exclusive society or group, usually with some rite. <i>Hugh and his friends were <b>inducted</b> into the most honourable seats.</i>
<b>instal</b>	Place. <i>The new president was <b>installed</b> immediately after the election.</i>
<b>instate</b>	Set up in position; install or establish. <i>Many of the troops had only joined up when the new regime was <b>instated</b>.</i>
<b>institute</b>	Advance or set forth in court. <i><b>Institute</b> proceedings.</i>
<b>introduce</b>	Put or introduce into something. <i>Bills can be <b>introduced</b> in either House of Parliament.</i>
<b>invest</b>	Make an investment. <i>I <b>invested</b> in an expensive moisturizer and tried to drink more water.</i>
<b>locate</b>	Discover the exact place or position of. <i>The company <b>located</b> some of their agents in Los Angeles.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The man who <b>lodged</b> in the room next door.</i>
<b>place</b>	Identify the location or place of. <i>She eventually said she couldn't <b>place</b> him.</i>
<b>plant</b>	Cover or supply an area of land with plants. <i>They claimed that the drugs had been <b>planted</b> on them by police.</i>
<b>plump</b>	Make fat or plump. <i>I <b>plumped</b> for the losing candidates.</i>
<b>position</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>A development plan which will <b>position</b> the city as a major economic force in the region.</i>
<b>put</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>They <b>put</b> my name on the cover page.</i>
<b>put in</b>	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
<b>put in place</b>	Make an investment.
<b>seat</b>	Of a vehicle or building have seats for a specified number of people. <i>The host <b>seated</b> me next to Mrs Smith.</i>
<b>set in place</b>	Apply or start.
<b>set up</b>	Urge to attack someone.

<b>settle</b>	End a legal dispute by arriving at a settlement. <i>Exactly what goes into the legislation has not been <b>settled</b>.</i>
<b>site</b>	Assign a location to. <i>The rectory is <b>sited</b> behind the church.</i>
<b>situate</b>	Put in context; describe the circumstances surrounding (something). <i>The pilot light is usually <b>situated</b> at the front of the boiler.</i>
<b>station</b>	Assign to a station. <i>Troops were <b>stationed</b> in the town.</i>
<b>swear in</b>	Utter obscenities or profanities.
<b>take on</b>	Occupy or take on.

- *He was installed as Prime Minister in 1966.*

- *The new president was installed immediately after the election.*

<b>appropriately</b>	In a manner that is suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>Walls of raw concrete form a neutral yet <b>appropriately</b> rugged backdrop for the various objects.</i>
<b>aptly</b>	In a manner that is appropriate or suitable in the circumstances. <i>America's <b>aptly</b> named Sunshine State.</i>
<b>arrange</b>	Arrange attractively. <i>Can you <b>arrange</b> a meeting with the President.</i>
<b>arranged</b>	Deliberately arranged for effect. <i>An <b>arranged</b> marriage.</i>
<b>automate</b>	Convert (a process or facility) to be operated by largely automatic equipment. <i><b>Automate</b> the movement of the robot.</i>
<b>configure</b>	Set up for a particular purpose. <i>The memory can be <b>configured</b> as a virtual drive.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>He was <b>created</b> a baronet.</i>
<b>database</b>	An organized body of related information. <i><b>Database</b> systems.</i>
<b>electronically</b>	In a way that relates to electrons. <i>Molecules that can accept energy to form <b>electronically</b> excited states.</i>
<b>equipped</b>	Provided or fitted out with what is necessary or useful or appropriate. <i>A well <b>equipped</b> playground.</i>
<b>establish</b>	Establish the validity of something as by an example explanation or experiment. <i>He had <b>established</b> himself as a film star.</i>
<b>fixing</b>	The action of fastening something in place. <i>Police investigating the alleged <b>fixing</b> of horse races.</i>
<b>found</b>	Use as a basis for found on. <i><b>Found</b> art.</i>
<b>furnish</b>	Give something useful or necessary to. <i>She was able to <b>furnish</b> me with details of the incident.</i>
<b>institute</b>	An organization having a particular purpose, especially one that is involved with science, education, or a specific profession. <i>The award was <b>instituted</b> in 1900.</i>

<b>ordered</b>	Having a systematic arrangement; especially having elements succeeding in order according to rule. <i>An <b>ordered</b> sequence.</i>
<b>organize</b>	Plan and direct (a complex undertaking). <i>Social programmes are <b>organized</b> by the school.</i>
<b>prepare</b>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i><b>Prepare</b> a brief summary of the article.</i>
<b>prepared</b>	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <i>A <b>prepared</b> statement.</i>
<b>properly</b>	In the right manner. <i>Please do your job <b>properly</b>.</i>
<b>ready</b>	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>Those who have <b>ready</b> access to the arts.</i>
<b>rig</b>	The particular way in which a sailing boat's masts, sails and rigging are arranged. <i>The power plant of the lifeboat had been <b>rigged</b> to explode.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. <i><b>Set</b> up an experiment.</i>
<b>setting</b>	The context and environment in which something is set. <i>You can't do that in a university <b>setting</b>.</i>
<b>setup</b>	An act that incriminates someone on a false charge. <i>It takes time to learn the <b>setup</b> around here.</i>
<b>software</b>	(computer science) written programs or procedures or rules and associated documentation pertaining to the operation of a computer system and that are stored in read/write memory. <i>The market for <b>software</b> is expected to expand.</i>
<b>standby</b>	Ready for emergency use. <i>Passengers were obliged to go on <b>standby</b>.</i>
<b>suitably</b>	In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances. <i>The judges were <b>suitably</b> impressed.</i>
<b>troubleshoot</b>	Analyse and solve serious problems for a company or other organization. <i>Follow the error messages to <b>troubleshoot</b>.</i>
