case in point	A special set of circumstances.
example	Punishment intended as a warning to others. <i>There is an example on page 10.</i>
<u>exemplar</u>	Something to be imitated. <i>The place is an exemplar of multicultural Britain.</i>
exemplification	A representational or typifying form or model.
illustration	The action or fact of illustrating something. <i>An illustration of a yacht.</i>
occasion	A special or noteworthy event, ceremony, or celebration. <i>Sunday lunch has a suitable sense of occasion about it.</i>
<u>occurrence</u>	An instance of something occurring. <i>The occurrence of cancer increases with age.</i>
representative	An employee of a travel company who lives in a resort and looks after the needs of its holidaymakers. <i>Make your own way to the Valley Inn where you will be contacted by our tour representative.</i>
representative case	A person who represents others.
<u>sample</u>	A specimen taken for scientific testing or analysis. <i>Piano samples.</i>
<u>specimen</u>	An example of something regarded as typical of its class or group. <i>Carla could not help feeling a degree of reluctant admiration for this odd female specimen.</i>

Synonyms of "Instance" as a verb (13 Words)

adduce	Advance evidence for. <i>A number of factors are adduced to explain the situation.</i>
allude to	Make a more or less disguised reference to.
<u>cite</u>	Refer to for illustration or proof. <i>Medics have been cited as a key example of a modern breed of technical expert.</i>
<u>exemplify</u>	Be a typical example of. <i>He exemplified his point with an anecdote.</i>
<u>give</u>	Give or supply. <i>Committees who give so generously of their time and effort.</i>
give as an example	Deliver in exchange or recompense.
<u>illustrate</u>	Explain or make (something) clear by using examples, charts, pictures, etc. <i>Illustrate a book with drawings.</i>
make reference to	Perform or carry out.
mention	Make mention of. <i>I haven't mentioned it to William yet.</i>
point out	Intend (something) to move towards a certain goal.
point to	Give a point to.
<u>quote</u>	Put quote marks around. <i>Quote prices for cars.</i>
refer to	Seek information from.

advisory	Giving advice. <i>A frost advisory.</i>
archetypal	Very typical of a certain kind of person or thing. <i>An archetypal journey representing the quest for identity.</i>

<u>archetype</u>	(in Jungian theory) a primitive mental image inherited from the earliest human ancestors, and supposed to be present in the collective unconscious. <i>An instrument which was the archetype of the early flute.</i>
case	An agreed summary of the facts relating to a legal case drawn up for review or decision on a point of law by a higher court. <i>Vicky was a very sad case.</i>
emulation	(computer science) technique of one machine obtaining the same results as another. <i>A model worthy of emulation.</i>
<u>epitome</u>	A summary of a written work; an abstract. <i>She looked the epitome of elegance and good taste.</i>
example	A written problem or exercise designed to illustrate a rule. <i>There is an example on page 10.</i>
<u>exemplar</u>	Something to be imitated. <i>The place is an exemplar of multicultural Britain.</i>
<u>exemplary</u>	Serving as a desirable model; very good. <i>Exemplary behaviour.</i>
<u>exemplify</u>	Be a typical example of. <i>He exemplified his point with an anecdote.</i>
formation	The action of forming or process of being formed. <i>The formation of gas in the intestine.</i>
framework	An essential supporting structure of a building, vehicle, or object. <i>Providing a factual framework for future research.</i>
herbarium	A room or building housing a herbarium.
illustration	A visual representation (a picture or diagram) that is used make some subject more pleasing or easier to understand. <i>An illustration of a yacht.</i>
model	Create a representation or model of. <i>Every child needs a role model.</i>
monitory	(in church use) a letter of admonition from the Pope or a bishop. <i>The chill monitory wail of an air raid siren.</i>
multiphase	(of an electrical device or circuit) polyphase.
<u>original</u>	An original creation i e an audio recording from which copies can be made. <i>The book still has its original binding.</i>
<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>Society's paradigm of the ideal woman.</i>

paradigmatic	Of or denoting the relationship between a set of linguistic items that form mutually exclusive choices in particular syntactic roles. <i>His biography is paradigmatic of the experiences of this generation.</i>
personality	The combination of characteristics or qualities that form an individual's distinctive character. <i>She had a sunny personality that was very engaging.</i>
prototype	Make a prototype of a product. <i>The construction of bandpass networks from low pass prototypes.</i>
quintessence	The aspect of something regarded as the intrinsic and central constituent of its character. <i>We were all brought up to believe that advertising is the quintessence of marketing.</i>
sample	Take a sample of. <i>Piano samples.</i>
specimen	A sample for medical testing, especially of urine. <i>Specimens of copper ore.</i>
spheroid	A solid generated by a half revolution of an ellipse about its major axis prolate spheroid or minor axis oblate spheroid. <i>It looked like a sphere but on closer examination I saw it was really a spheroid.</i>
type	Identify as belonging to a certain type. <i>The capable type.</i>
typify	Represent; symbolize. <i>Tough, low-lying vegetation typifies this arctic area.</i>
universality	The quality of being universal; existing everywhere. <i>The universality of the experience of grief and loss.</i>
virtue	The quality of doing what is right and avoiding what is wrong. <i>Mike was extolling the virtues of the car.</i>
