Without restrictions or stipulations or further payments.

outright

They decided to buy the company outright.

right away

 An interjection expressing agreement.

straightaway Without delay or hesitation; with no time intervening.

Found an answer **straightaway**.

suddenly Quickly and unexpectedly.

**extempore** Without prior preparation.

A fortune teller with dire warnings about **impending** doom.

**impromptu** without advance preparation.

He spoke **impromptu**.

Create and perform (music, drama, or verse) spontaneously or without

**improvise** preparation.

He invited actors to **improvise** dialogue.

Created and performed spontaneously or without preparation;

**improvised** impromptu.

Crossed the river on **improvised** bridges.
