- Without delay or hesitation; with no time intervening.
- Urgently or persistently.





## Synonyms of "Instantly" as an adverb (19 Words)

abruptly	Suddenly and unexpectedly. The forested terrain ascends <b>abruptly</b> .
all of a sudden	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (`whole' is often used informally for `wholly.
directly	Exactly in a specified position. The ceiling <b>directly</b> above the door.
<u>forthwith</u>	Out into view. An official accused of dishonesty should be suspended <b>forthwith</b> .
here and now	At this time; now.
immediately	Bearing an immediate relation. She was sitting <b>immediately</b> behind me.
in a flash	To or toward the inside of.



instantaneously	Instantly; at once. Soldiers must be ready to react <b>instantaneously</b> .
now	(in a narrative or account of past events) at the time spoken of or referred to. It could happen any time <b>now</b> .
<u>outright</u>	Without restrictions or stipulations or further payments. They decided to buy the company <b>outright</b> .
right away	An interjection expressing agreement.
straight away	In a straight line; in a direct course.
straight off	In a straight line; in a direct course.
straightaway	Without delay or hesitation; with no time intervening. Found an answer <b>straightaway</b> .
suddenly	Quickly and unexpectedly. <i>He made up his mind <b>suddenly</b>.</i>
that very minute	Used as intensifiers; `real' is sometimes used informally for `really'; `rattling' is informal.
then and there	Subsequently or soon afterward (often used as sentence connectors.
there and then	To or toward that place; away from the speaker.
this very minute	Used as intensifiers; `real' is sometimes used informally for `really'; `rattling' is informal.

# Associations of "Instantly" (30 Words)

currently	At the present time. The EC is <b>currently</b> attempting greater economic integration.
directly	In a frank way. The ceiling <b>directly</b> above the door.
<u>exigent</u>	Demanding attention. The <b>exigent</b> demands of her contemporaries music took a toll on her voice.
extemporaneous	With little or no preparation or forethought. An <b>extemporaneous</b> speech.
extempore	Without prior preparation. <i>He recited the poem <b>extempore</b></i> .
extemporize	Perform without preparation. He <b>extemporize</b> d a speech at the wedding.
immediate	Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect. No changes are envisaged in the <b>immediate</b> future.
immediately	In direct or very close relation. <i>He answered <b>immediately</b>.</i>
imminent	Overhanging. They were in <b>imminent</b> danger of being swept away.
<u>impending</u>	Close in time; about to occur. A fortune teller with dire warnings about <b>impending</b> doom.
<u>impromptu</u>	A short musical passage that seems to have been made spontaneously without advance preparation. <i>He spoke impromptu</i> .
<u>improvise</u>	Create and perform (music, drama, or verse) spontaneously or without preparation. <i>He invited actors to improvise dialogue.</i>
improvised	Created and performed spontaneously or without preparation; impromptu. <i>Crossed the river on improvised bridges.</i>



<u>instant</u>	Instant coffee.
	Become an <b>instant</b> millionaire.
instantaneous	Occurring with no delay. Modern methods of <b>instantaneous</b> communication.
instantaneously	Without any delay. Soldiers must be ready to react <b>instantaneously</b> .
now	The momentary present. <i>Come here <b>now</b></i> .
offhand	Ungraciously or offensively nonchalant or cool in manner. I can t think of a better answer <b>offhand</b> .
<u>outright</u>	Wholly and completely. She couldn t ask him <b>outright</b> .
presently	After a short time; soon. She will arrive <b>presently</b> .
pressing	Expressing something strongly or persistently. A <b>pressing</b> invitation.
prompt	The time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note. <i>She is always</i> <b>prompt</b> <i>to help her friends.</i>
<u>promptly</u>	In a punctual manner. <i>He did his homework <b>promptly</b>.</i>
realized	Successfully completed or brought to an end. The joy of a <b>realized</b> ambition overcame him.
spontaneously	Without apparent external cause or stimulus. <i>Mutations can occur <b>spontaneously</b></i> .
<u>swiftly</u>	Without delay; after a very short time. They acted <b>swiftly</b> in response to the invasion.
<u>today</u>	This present day. <b>Today</b> almost every home has television.
<u>tomorrow</u>	The near future. Today s engineers are <b>tomorrow</b> s buyers.
unplug	Disconnect (an electrical device) by removing its plug from a socket. <i>She unplugged the fridge.</i>
yesterday	On the day preceding today. My wife had a baby boy <b>yesterday</b> morning.
