Instructs as a Verb

Definitions of "Instructs" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “instructs” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Give instructions or directions for some task.*
- *Make aware of.*
- *Impart skills or knowledge to.*



Synonyms of "Instructs" as a verb (4 Words)

apprise Inform or tell (someone).
*I thought it right to **apprise** Chris of what had happened.*

apprize Increase the value of.
*How highly your Highness **apprizeth** peace.*

learn Find out learn or determine with certainty usually by making an inquiry or other effort.
*I d **learned** too many grim poems in school.*

teach Work as a teacher.
*The philosophy **teaches** self control.*



Usage Examples of "Instructs" as a verb

- *She instructed the students to work on their pronunciation.*
- *He instructed me in building a boat.*



Associations of "Instructs" (30 Words)

- admonition** A firm rebuke.
*He received numerous **admonitions** for his behaviour.*
- admonitory** Expressing reproof or reproach especially as a corrective.
*The sergeant lifted an **admonitory** finger.*
- advise** Offer suggestions about the best course of action to someone.
*He **advised** caution.*
- advisor** An expert who gives advice.
*The United States sent military **advisors** to Guatemala.*
- apprise** Make aware of.
*I thought it right to **apprise** Chris of what had happened.*
- consult** An act of consulting a professional a consultation.
*The government must **consult** with interested bodies.*

counsel	Consultation, especially to seek or give advice. <i>The lawyer counselled me when I was accused of tax fraud.</i>
educate	Provide or pay for instruction for (one's child), especially at a school. <i>A plan to educate the young on the dangers of drugs.</i>
education	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>Colleges of education.</i>
educational	Relating to the provision of education. <i>An educational film.</i>
educator	A person who provides instruction or education; a teacher. <i>The perspective of a professional educator.</i>
expostulate	Express strong disapproval or disagreement. <i>He found Fox expostulating with a young man.</i>
guidance	Advice or information aimed at resolving a problem or difficulty, especially as given by someone in authority. <i>A laser guidance system.</i>
hortative	Giving strong encouragement.
hortatory	Giving strong encouragement. <i>A series of hortatory epistles.</i>
instruction	A direction or order. <i>He was acting on my instructions.</i>
instructor	A person whose occupation is teaching. <i>A driving instructor.</i>
lecture	Deliver a lecture or talk. <i>A lecture hall.</i>
lesson	A unit of instruction. <i>An advanced lesson in maths.</i>
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. <i>The arms have been matriculated by the Lord Lyon King of Arms in Edinburgh.</i>
mentor	An experienced and trusted adviser. <i>Both trainees were expertly mentored by a site supervisor.</i>
pedagogics	The principles and methods of instruction.
pedagogy	The profession of a teacher. <i>The relationship between applied linguistics and language pedagogy.</i>

reading	The action or skill of reading. <i>A poetry reading.</i>
<u>schooling</u>	Education received at school. <i>Schooling fences.</i>
teach	A teacher. <i>She came to say Hi to her old teach.</i>
<u>teacher</u>	A person whose occupation is teaching. <i>Books were his teachers.</i>
tell	Decide or determine correctly or with certainty. <i>I couldn't tell if he believed me.</i>
<u>tuition</u>	Teaching or instruction, especially of individual pupils or small groups. <i>Private tuition in French.</i>
<u>university</u>	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at university.</i>
