- invincible** Too powerful to be defeated or overcome.

- unassailable** Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with.
*An **unassailable** lead.*
- unconquerable** Not capable of being conquered or vanquished or overcome.

- unsurmountable** Not capable of being surmounted or overcome.
***Unsurmountable** problems.*

abstruse	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>An abstruse philosophical inquiry.</i>
abysmal	Very deep. <i>Abysmal misery.</i>
confound	Be confusing or perplexing to; cause to be unable to think clearly. <i>We will confound these tactics by the pressure groups.</i>
<u>conundrum</u>	A difficult problem. <i>One of the most difficult conundrums for the experts.</i>
crossword	A puzzle in which words corresponding to numbered clues are to be found and written in to squares in the puzzle. <i>She settled down to do the crossword.</i>
<u>cryptic</u>	Having a secret or hidden meaning. <i>A cryptic note.</i>
cryptogram	A piece of writing in code or cipher.
difficulty	A thing that is hard to accomplish, deal with, or understand. <i>Finished the test only with great difficulty.</i>
<u>enigma</u>	Something that baffles understanding and cannot be explained. <i>Madeleine was still an enigma to him.</i>
esoterica	Esoteric or highly specialized subjects or publications. <i>A professor of such esoterica as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
factorize	Resolve (a polynomial) into factors. <i>All matrices can be factorized.</i>
ineluctable	Unable to be resisted or avoided; inescapable. <i>The ineluctable facts of history.</i>
<u>inevitable</u>	Invariably occurring or appearing. <i>By the morning he had accepted the inevitable.</i>
<u>labyrinthine</u>	(of a network) like a labyrinth; irregular and twisting. <i>A labyrinthine network of tortuous footpaths.</i>
<u>mystery</u>	The Christian Eucharist. <i>Much of her past is shrouded in mystery.</i>
<u>necessarily</u>	As a necessary result; inevitably. <i>Such expenses are necessarily incurred.</i>
preternatural	Surpassing the ordinary or normal. <i>Autumn had arrived with preternatural speed.</i>

problem	An inquiry starting from given conditions to investigate or demonstrate a fact, result, or law. <i>Our homework consisted of ten problems to solve.</i>
puzzle	A jigsaw puzzle. <i>A book with picture puzzles.</i>
question	Pose a series of questions to. <i>We must question your judgment in this matter.</i>
riddle	Speak in riddles. <i>Riddle me a riddle.</i>
solve	Find the solution to (a problem or question) or understand the meaning of. <i>The policy could solve the town's housing crisis.</i>
superhuman	Above or beyond the human or demanding more than human power or endurance. <i>The pilot made one last superhuman effort not to come down right on our heads.</i>
tantalize	Torment or tease (someone) with the sight or promise of something that is unobtainable. <i>Such ambitious questions have long tantalized the world's best thinkers.</i>
unavoidable	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>The natural and unavoidable consequences of growing old.</i>
unfathomable	Incapable of being fully understood. <i>Mountains of unfathomable scale.</i>
unresolved	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>Many problems remain unresolved.</i>
unscramble	Restore (something that has been scrambled) to an intelligible, readable, or viewable state. <i>But how do we unscramble our feelings.</i>
unsolved	Not solved. <i>Many crimes remain unsolved.</i>
whodunit	A story about a crime (usually murder) presented as a novel or play or movie.
