## Intangible as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Intangible" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "intangible" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of especially business assets) not having physical substance or intrinsic productive*

value.

- Unable to be touched; not having physical presence.
- Incapable of being perceived by the senses especially the sense of touch- James Jeans.
- (of an asset or benefit) not constituting or represented by a physical object and of a value not precisely measurable.
- Lacking substance or reality; incapable of being touched or seen.
- Hard to pin down or identify.
- Not having physical substance or intrinsic productive value.
- Incapable of being perceived by the senses especially the sense of touch.
- Difficult or impossible to define or understand; vague and abstract.

## Synonyms of "Intangible" as an adjective (13 Words)

<b><u>abstract</u></b>	Dealing with a subject in the abstract without practical purpose or intention. <i>We have been discussing the problem in a very <b>abstract</b> manner.</i>
<b>bodiless</b>	Having no material form or being; incorporeal. <i>A sinister <b>bodiless</b> voice.</i>
<b>disembodied</b>	Not having a material body. <i>A <b>disembodied</b> ghost.</i>
<b>impalpable</b>	Not easily comprehended. <i>An <b>impalpable</b> ghost.</i>
<b>incorporeal</b>	Not composed of matter; having no material existence. <i>A supreme but <b>incorporeal</b> being called God.</i>
<b>indefinable</b>	Defying expression or description. <i>An abstract concept that seems <b>indefinable</b>.</i>
<b><u>indescribable</u></b>	Defying expression or description. <i>Most prisoners suffered <b>indescribable</b> hardship.</i>
<b>inexpressible</b>	Defying expression. <i>A mood of <b>inexpressible</b> longing.</i>
<b><u>invisible</u></b>	Relating to or denoting earnings which a country makes from the sale of services or other items not constituting tangible commodities. <i>This <b>invisible</b> gas is present to some extent in every home.</i>
<b>nameless</b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>Some pictures were taken by a <b>nameless</b> photographer.</i>
<b>nonphysical</b>	Lacking substance or reality; incapable of being touched or seen.
<b>unembodied</b>	Not having a material body. <i>Claims to knowledge of an <b>unembodied</b> consciousness.</i>

**untouchable** Impossible to assail.  
*When the band retreat to ambience and minimalism they are **untouchable**.*

## Usage Examples of "Intangible" as an adjective

- *The rose symbolized something intangible about their relationship.*
- *The moonlight made things seem intangible.*
- *Intangible assets such as good will.*
- *The intangible constituent of energy.*
- *That intangible thing—the soul.*

## Associations of "Intangible" (30 Words)

<b>abstract</b>	Consider a concept without thinking of a specific example consider abstractly or theoretically. <i>An <b>abstract</b> of her speech.</i>
<b>ambiguity</b>	The quality of being open to more than one interpretation; inexactness. <i>We can detect no <b>ambiguity</b> in this section of the Act.</i>
<b>ambiguous</b>	Open to two or more interpretations; or of uncertain nature or significance; or (often) intended to mislead. <i>The election result was <b>ambiguous</b>.</i>
<b>ambiguously</b>	So as to be open to more than one interpretation. <i>A peculiar <b>ambiguously</b> remembered landscape where past and present seem repeatedly confounded.</i>
<b>ambivalent</b>	Having mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something or someone. <i>An <b>ambivalent</b> attitude to Europe.</i>
<b>blur</b>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>Tears <b>blurred</b> her vision.</i>
<b>blurred</b>	Not clear or distinct; hazy. <i>The <b>blurred</b> distinctions between childhood and adulthood.</i>
<b>blurry</b>	Unable to perceive clear or sharp images. <i>Vision may be hazy or <b>blurry</b> for a few days after surgery.</i>
<b>circumlocution</b>	An indirect way of expressing something. <i>He used a number of poetic <b>circumlocutions</b>.</i>

<b><u>elusive</u></b>	Difficult to find, catch, or achieve. <i>That <b>elusive</b> thing the soul.</i>
<b><u>equivocate</u></b>	Use ambiguous language so as to conceal the truth or avoid committing oneself. <i>The government have <b>equivocated</b> too often in the past.</i>
<b>euphemism</b>	A mild or indirect word or expression substituted for one considered to be too harsh or blunt when referring to something unpleasant or embarrassing. <i>The jargon has given us downsizing as a <b>euphemism</b> for cuts.</i>
<b><u>evasive</u></b>	Avoiding or escaping from difficulty or danger especially enemy fire. <i>They decided to take <b>evasive</b> action.</i>
<b>illegibility</b>	The quality of writing (print or handwriting) that cannot be deciphered.
<b><u>immaterial</u></b>	(often followed by `to') lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other. <i>The price was <b>immaterial</b>.</i>
<b>impalpable</b>	Incapable of being perceived by the senses especially the sense of touch- James Jeans. <i>An <b>impalpable</b> cloud.</i>
<b>imprecision</b>	Lack of exactness or accuracy. <i>All scientific measurements come with some degree of <b>imprecision</b>.</i>
<b>indeterminate</b>	(of a condition) from which a diagnosis of the underlying cause cannot be made. <i>Of <b>indeterminate</b> age.</i>
<b>lightproof</b>	Able to block out light completely. <i>A <b>lightproof</b> envelope.</i>
<b>nebulous</b>	Lacking definite form or limits. <i><b>Nebulous</b> reasons.</i>
<b>noncommittal</b>	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like. <i>Her boyfriend was <b>noncommittal</b> about their future together.</i>
<b>nuance</b>	Give nuances to. <i>He was familiar with the <b>nuances</b> of the local dialect.</i>
<b><u>obscure</u></b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>An <b>obscure</b> turn of phrase.</i>
<b>opaqueness</b>	The quality of being opaque to a degree; the degree to which something reduces the passage of light.
<b><u>subtle</u></b>	Difficult to detect or grasp by the mind or analyze. <i>The German plan was simple yet <b>subtle</b>.</i>

- subtlety** A subtle distinction, feature, or argument.  
*The textural **subtlety** of Degas.*
- unclear** Not clear to the mind.  
*The law itself was **unclear** on that point.*
- undifferentiated** Not different or differentiated.  
*By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet **undifferentiated** between male and female.*
- vague** Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So.  
***Vague** forms of speech have so long passed for mysteries of science.*
- vaguely** In a way that is unfocused or lacks attention; absent-mindedly.  
*He looked **vaguely** familiar.*
