erode Gradually destroy or be gradually destroyed.

The cliffs on this coast have been **erode**d by the sea.

gradually

In a gradual way; slowly; by degrees.

The situation gradually improved.

She **trudge**d through blinding snow.

Make or become weaker in power, resolve, or physical strength.

The prisoner's resistance weakened after seven days.
