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Associations of "Intelligently" (30 Words)

absorbed	Retained without reflection. <i>The stones warm slowly throughout the day then radiate absorbed heat at night.</i>
<u>attentive</u>	(often followed by `to') giving care or attention. <i>Ministers should be more attentive to the interests of taxpayers.</i>
aware	Having or showing knowledge or understanding or realization or perception. <i>Everyone needs to become more environmentally aware.</i>
<u>careful</u>	Exercising caution or showing care or attention. <i>Careful of her feelings.</i>
carefully	In a way that deliberately avoids harm or errors; cautiously. <i>He listened carefully to the way people spoke.</i>
<u>cautious</u>	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>The plan received a cautious welcome.</i>
<u>considerate</u>	Showing concern for the rights and feelings of others. <i>She was unfailingly kind and considerate.</i>
contemplate	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Contemplate one's navel.</i>
<u>contemplative</u>	A person devoted to the contemplative life. <i>Contemplative knowledge of God.</i>
decline	Go down in value. <i>The sun began to creep round to the west and to decline.</i>
<u>deliberate</u>	Characterized by conscious design or purpose. <i>A deliberate attempt to provoke conflict.</i>
deposition	The act of deposing someone; removing a powerful person from a position or office. <i>Pebbles formed by the deposition of calcium in solution.</i>

erode	Gradually destroy or be gradually destroyed. <i>The cliffs on this coast have been eroded by the sea.</i>
<u>gradually</u>	In a gradual way; slowly; by degrees. <i>The situation gradually improved.</i>
information	In information theory a mathematical quantity expressing the probability of occurrence of a particular sequence of symbols impulses etc as against that of alternative sequences. <i>Genetically transmitted information.</i>
<u>leisurely</u>	Acting or done at leisure; unhurried or relaxed. <i>At a leisurely or easygoing pace.</i>
meditative	Deeply or seriously thoughtful. <i>Meditative techniques.</i>
motion	An optical illusion of motion produced by viewing a rapid succession of still pictures of a moving object. <i>Councillor Byrne motioned that the committee call on the area manager to install street lighting.</i>
observant	A member of a branch of the Franciscan order that followed a strict rule. <i>Her observant eye took in every detail.</i>
pensive	Showing pensive sadness. <i>A pensive mood.</i>
plod	The act of walking with a slow heavy gait. <i>He settled down to a steady plod.</i>
<u>precision</u>	Marked by or adapted for accuracy and exactness. <i>The deal was planned and executed with military precision.</i>
<u>preoccupied</u>	Having or showing excessive or compulsive concern with something. <i>A preoccupied frown.</i>
<u>reflective</u>	Providing a reflection; capable of reflecting light or other radiation. <i>Reflective clothing.</i>
scrupulous	Very concerned to avoid doing wrong. <i>The research has been carried out with scrupulous attention to detail.</i>
slowly	Without speed slow is sometimes used informally for slowly. <i>He spoke slowly.</i>
subjectively	In a way that is dependent on the mind for existence. <i>The natural tendency we have to impute subjectively perceived qualities to objects.</i>
<u>thoughtfully</u>	With careful consideration or attention. <i>The government thoughtfully offered to foot part of the bill.</i>

trudge

A difficult or laborious walk.

She **trudged** through blinding snow.

weaken

Make or become weaker in power, resolve, or physical strength.

The prisoner's resistance **weakened** after seven days.
