<u>attentive</u>	(often followed by `to') giving care or attention. Ministers should be more attentive to the interests of taxpayers.
aware	Having or showing knowledge or understanding or realization or perception. <i>Everyone needs to become more environmentally</i> aware .
<u>careful</u>	Exercising caution or showing care or attention. <i>Careful</i> of her feelings.
carefully	In a way that deliberately avoids harm or errors; cautiously. <i>He listened carefully to the way people spoke.</i>
<u>cautious</u>	People who are fearful and cautious. The plan received a cautious welcome.
<u>considerate</u>	Showing concern for the rights and feelings of others. She was unfailingly kind and considerate .
contemplate	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Contemplate</i> one s navel.
<u>contemplative</u>	A person devoted to the contemplative life. Contemplative knowledge of God.
decline	Go down in value. The sun began to creep round to the west and to decline .
<u>deliberate</u>	Characterized by conscious design or purpose. A deliberate attempt to provoke conflict.
deposition	The act of deposing someone; removing a powerful person from a position or office. Pebbles formed by the deposition of calcium in solution.



erode	Gradually destroy or be gradually destroyed. The cliffs on this coast have been erode d by the sea.
<u>gradually</u>	In a gradual way; slowly; by degrees. The situation gradually improved.
information	In information theory a mathematical quantity expressing the probability of occurrence of a particular sequence of symbols impulses etc as against that of alternative sequences. <i>Genetically transmitted information</i> .
<u>leisurely</u>	Acting or done at leisure; unhurried or relaxed. At a leisurely or easygoing pace.
meditative	Deeply or seriously thoughtful. <i>Meditative</i> techniques.
motion	An optical illusion of motion produced by viewing a rapid succession of still pictures of a moving object. Councillor Byrne motion ed that the committee call on the area manager to install street lighting.
observant	A member of a branch of the Franciscan order that followed a strict rule. <i>Her observant eye took in every detail.</i>
pensive	Showing pensive sadness. A pensive mood.
plod	The act of walking with a slow heavy gait. <i>He settled down to a steady plod.</i>
precision	Marked by or adapted for accuracy and exactness. The deal was planned and executed with military precision .
<u>preoccupied</u>	Having or showing excessive or compulsive concern with something. A preoccupied frown.
<u>reflective</u>	Providing a reflection; capable of reflecting light or other radiation. <i>Reflective</i> clothing.
scrupulous	Very concerned to avoid doing wrong. The research has been carried out with scrupulous attention to detail.
slowly	Without speed slow is sometimes used informally for slowly. <i>He spoke slowly</i> .
subjectively	In a way that is dependent on the mind for existence. <i>The natural tendency we have to impute subjectively perceived qualities to objects.</i>
<u>thoughtfully</u>	With careful consideration or attention. The government thoughtfully offered to foot part of the bill.
