augment	Enlarge or increase. <i>The recent speech of the president augmented tensions in the Near East.</i>
bolster	Prop up with a pillow or bolster. <i>They bolstered the seats for a more comfortable ride.</i>
bond	Money that must be forfeited by the bondsman if an accused person fails to appear in court for trial. <i>There was a bond of understanding between them.</i>
brace	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>A neck brace.</i>
cooperation	The action or process of working together to the same end. <i>Their cooperation with us was essential for the success of our mission.</i>
deepen	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. <i>They deepened the lake so that bigger pleasure boats could use it.</i>
defensible	Justifiable by argument. <i>A morally defensible penal system.</i>
development	A district that has been developed to serve some purpose. <i>A major housing development in Essex.</i>
enhance	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This will enhance your enjoyment.</i>
escalate	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>We do not want to escalate the war.</i>
exacerbate	Exasperate or irritate. <i>The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only exacerbated the problem.</i>
fortify	Add nutrients to. <i>Most commercial brands of almond milk are fortified with vitamins A, D, B2, B12, calcium, and zinc.</i>

<u>harden</u>	Cause to accept or become hardened to habituate. <i>Wait for the glue to harden.</i>
heighten	Make or become more intense. <i>The pleasure was heightened by the sense of guilt that accompanied it.</i>
increase	The amount by which something increases. <i>He gave me an increase in salary.</i>
intensification	The act of increasing the contrast of (a photographic film). <i>The intensification of the conflict.</i>
intension	The internal content of a concept.
<u>intensity</u>	The amount of energy transmitted (as by acoustic or electromagnetic radiation). <i>He adjusted the intensity of the sound.</i>
meliorate	Get better.
<u>optimize</u>	Act as an optimist and take a sunny view of the world. <i>We manage our time so that we optimize our productivity.</i>
ossify	Make rigid and set into a conventional pattern. <i>These tracheal cartilages may ossify.</i>
<u>reinforce</u>	Strengthen and support with rewards. <i>Let s reinforce good behavior.</i>
<u>reinforcement</u>	A stimulus that strengthens or weakens the behavior that produced it. <i>His gestures provided eloquent reinforcement for his complaints.</i>
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>The activists urged militant factions to rise up.</i>
<u>sharpen</u>	Make or become sharp or sharper. <i>They ve got to sharpen up in front of the goal.</i>
strength	Capability in terms of personnel and materiel that affect the capacity to fight a war. <i>The solution comes in two strengths.</i>
strengthen	Give a healthy elasticity to. <i>Strengthen the relations between the two countries.</i>
<u>stronghold</u>	A strongly fortified defensive structure. <i>A Labour stronghold.</i>
toughen	Make or become stronger or more resilient. <i>Proposals to toughen up sentencing policy.</i>
<u>widening</u>	The act of making something wider.
